## Saint Saviour's Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Saint Saviour's Union, in the County of London;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the 24th day of July, 1847, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within certain Unions, including the said Saint Saviour's Union; and by Article 182 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the Article abovementioned as regards the Medical Officer for the Workhouse of the said Union known as the Saint George's Workhouse:—

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend, with

respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the Saint George's Workhouse of the said Saint Saviour's Union, the operation of Article 182 of the above-cited Order until We, by an Order under Our Seal of Office, shall otherwise direct.

### THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Revocation.

1. Chapter 34 (ISLE OF MAN) of The Animals Order of 1886 dated the sixteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, so far as the same relates to cattle, and the whole of Article 3 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1890, No. 2 dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Chapter or Article, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of

any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Chapter or Article, before the commencement of this Order.

#### Cattle from Isle of Man.

2. Unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, cattle brought from the Isle of Man shall be subject to the provisions of Part I (*Slaughter at Port of Landing*) of the Fifth Schedule to The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of Chapter 30 (FOREIGN ANIMALS SUBJECT TO SLAUGHTER) of the said Animals Order of 1886.

#### Amendment of Article 151 of The Animals Order of 1886.

3. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 151 of the said Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 151 of that Order (namely):

#### Conditions of Landing.

151.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place for foreign animals under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

*First.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the United States of America (provision as to which country is made by the second condition of this Article), or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands (provision as to which three countries is made by the third condition of this Article), or in the Isle of Man (provision as to which Isle is made by the fourth condition of this Article).

*Second.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the United States of America.

*Third.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands.

*Fourth.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any cattle exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the Isle of Man.

*Fifth.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the United States of America, or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands, or in the Isle of Man.

*Sixth.* That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or (subject to the seventh condition of this Article) in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in

the Netherlands, or (subject to the eighth condition of this Article) in the Isle of Man.

*Seventh.* That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands.

*Eighth.* That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any cattle exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the Isle of Man.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

*Interpretation.*

4. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1891.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

*Heath Point—Buoy not in Position.*

(3.) Halskov Reef Buoy is a light buoy. The light shows fixed white for about five seconds and is eclipsed about ten seconds; it is elevated 12 feet above the sea. The buoy, pointed white, has "Halskov Rev" in red letters on it, and carries a red frame.

Approximate position, lat.  $55^{\circ} 20'$  N., long.  $11^{\circ} 8'$  E.

Also, that on the same date, two leading lights (Grön Sound), which kept in line bearing N.  $25^{\circ}$  W. lead through Heste Head Deep, would be exhibited near Gaase Sand, west side of entrance to Grön Sound:—

Grön Sound Northern Light is a fixed white light, showing strongest in the line of the leading lights, and eastward to the bearing of N.  $34^{\circ}$  W. when it suddenly decreases in intensity; westward of the bearing N.  $19^{\circ}$  W. it is obscured by the high land of Falster. The light is elevated 63 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The light is shown from a white iron frame, 60 feet high, situated about 540 yards N.  $25^{\circ}$  W. from the Pilots' Tower.

Approximate position, latitude  $54^{\circ} 53' 10''$  N., longitude  $12^{\circ} 7' 20''$  E.

Grön Sound Southern Light is a fixed white light, visible from N.  $23^{\circ}$  W. to N.  $34^{\circ}$  W. (eastward of which it suddenly decreases in intensity), elevated 16 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of eight miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The light is shown from a white building, 11 feet high, situated close south-eastward of the Pilots' Tower.

Cape Barfleur Electric Light will be a flashing white light arranged in four groups, each flash having an approximate duration of half a second. In each group, the successive flashes will be shown at intervals of about two and a half seconds, and they will be separated by eclipses of about two seconds; an eclipse of eight seconds will separate the consecutive groups.

Approximate position, lat  $9^{\circ} 42'$  N., long.  $1^{\circ} 15\frac{1}{2}'$  W.

The fog signal to be established in the upper gallery of Cape Barfleur Lighthouse will be a siren, worked by compressed air, which will give a blast of three seconds duration every minute.

During the progress of the works, the existing light will be replaced by a provisional light of the same character, but of the fourth order. During this period, the electric light may be shown, and the fog signal sounded, experimentally, in an irregular manner.

**INCOME TAX.**

reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the service of the year 1798," being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners in the execution of the last-mentioned Act, to be holden at the Delegates' Room, Clarendon-buildings, Oxford, on Thursday, the 12th day of November, 1891, at a quarter-past eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing and appointing, according to the regulations of the said Income Tax Act of 1842, such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for general purposes for the said division of the University of Oxon, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen.
