

pumps, also a meter house, on piece of ground aforesaid.

3. A double set or line of conduit pipes from the said engine house, passing through lands of the Undertakers, in said parish, numbered 289, 288, and 302 on the said ordnance map, to and from a large covered service tank or reservoir, constructed upon land belonging to, or reputed to belong to, the Undertakers, about 440 yards distant from, and 150 feet in height above, the said wells and engine house.

4. An aqueduct or line of pipes connected with the said meter house hereinbefore described, and passing through lands belonging to, or reputed to belong to, the Undertakers, numbered 289 and 287 on said ordnance map, to the boundary of the town of Ross as fixed by "The Ross Improvement Act, 1865," and thence along Alton-street, Chesham-lane, Gloucester-road, High-street, Broad-street, Brook-end-street, Station-street, Henry-street, Contelupe-road, Ross Railway Station-road, Smallbrook-road, The Marsh, Brampton-street, Over Ross-street, The Tanyard-road, The Nursery-roads, Kyrle-street, Edde Cross-street, Dock-street, St. Mary's-street, Church-street, The Crofts, Dean-hill, Corps Cross-street, the Merrivale-roads, Ashfield-roads, Archenfield-road, Tudorville-roads, Walford-road, and other adjacent highways.

5. The waterworks situate in the Rope-walk, near the river Wye, heretofore known as the "Ross Waterworks," and marked on the aforesaid Ordnance Map, comprising engine house, pumping station, engines, water wheel, machinery, and plant, with all mains, pipes, aqueducts, sluice valves, hydrants, and fire plugs connected therewith, with preferent rights, secured to the Undertakers by deed, of and in the mill-stream known as the Rope-walk brook, and used as a motive power for pumping water from the river Wye and distributing the same throughout the town and district, which water is most suitable, and now chiefly used for trade purposes, steam boilers, baths, washing, street watering, &c.

6. A covered reservoir or storage tank for river water, situate beneath the public path on the west side of the lower churchyard, near the entrance gates. Also a covered storage tank or reservoir, capable of containing fifty thousand gallons, in a piece of land known as "The Prospect," numbered 238 on said Ordnance Map. For permission to build and use this reservoir, a nominal rent of one shilling per year is payable to the Ross Town Commissioners.

The intended Order will confer on the Undertakers the following, or some of the following powers, viz.:

To lay down, construct, and maintain conduit pipes and other works in, under, over, across, and along all roads, highways, streets, pipes, sewers, streams, bridges, and railways in the aforesaid parishes of Ross and Bridstow, within an area described by a circle with a radius of sixty chains, drawn from the junction of the four roads at the top or west end of Alton-street, and clearly shown upon the six-inch ordnance map of the district, which can be seen as hereunder mentioned.

To provide, sell, or let meters, and to supply water by meter.

To demand, take, and recover rates, rents, and charges within the aforesaid area for the supply of water, and for the hire of meters, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges.

To make special provision for the protection of

the works, property, and water supply of the Undertakers, and prohibiting the contamination and fouling thereof, and the waste or misuse of water.

To enter into and carry into effect contracts and arrangements for the supply of water, in bulk or otherwise, for any purpose whatever, with any Corporation, sanitary authority, railway company, and any other bodies or persons within or beyond the limits of the Order, and from time to time to vary, suspend, or rescind any such contracts or arrangements, and make others in lieu thereof or in addition thereto, and the Order will confer all necessary powers in that behalf upon all such corporations, authorities, bodies, and persons, and will or may enable all parties to any such contracts or arrangements to apply for the purpose—therefore any funds or moneys, and raise additional funds by rates or otherwise.

The Order will also confer upon the Undertakers all or some of the powers mentioned or referred to in the Gas and Waterworks Facilities Acts, 1870, and the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863, and all other powers usually conferred upon water companies, and will vary or extinguish all right and privileges which would impede or interfere with the objects aforesaid, or any other objects of the Order, and will confer other rights and privileges.

And notice is hereby given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant, an Ordnance Map of the district, showing the position of the said waterworks, and the limits of the area of supply authorised by the Order; and a copy of this Notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Hereford, at his office at Hereford, and at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London, S.W.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the 23rd day of December next, printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the office of the Board of Trade, and at the residence of the undersigned, at Lebanon, Ross, where such copies, when deposited, and also copies of the Provisional Order, when made, will be obtainable by all persons applying for the same, at the price of one shilling each.

Any Company, Corporation, or person wishing to make any representation to the Board of Trade, or to bring before them any objection respecting the proposed application for a Provisional Order, may do so by letter addressed to the Assistant Secretary of the Railway Department of the Board of Trade, on or before the 15th day of January now next ensuing, and such persons must, at the same time, send copies of their objections to the Undertakers at the residence of the undersigned, and in forwarding to the Board of Trade such objections, such persons must state that a copy of the same has been sent to the Undertakers.
