#### CHAPTER III.

SUPPLIES AND CHARGES.

Supplies, &c., by whom turnished.

IX. All necessaries, food, and attendance will be furnished to persons in quarantine by the Storekeeper-General at a fixed rate per diem, any difference between the actual cost and the rate recoverable being paid by Government.

Classing of Fassengers and others.

X. Every person on landing at a quarantine station shall enter in a book to be kept for the purpose by the Steward, his name and address, and whether he wishes to be supplied with first, second, or third class rations. Any person omitting to comply with this rule will be classed by the Steward.

Charges Recoverable.

XI. The following charges are payable and recoverable before the proper Court from persons who have classed themselves or been classed by the Steward:-Rs.

0.75 Third class Second class First class 4.00

Provided that it shall be in the discretion of the Magistrate to reduce the account, if he be satisfied that the food or lodging or attendance supplied was unsatisfactory.

Steward to obey Orders of Storekeeper-General.

XII. In everything connected with rations and supplies of all kinds to persons in quarantine stations, the Steward of the station shall be bound to obey all lawful orders of the Storekeeper-General.

Lodging.

XIII. The lodging provided will be in proportion to the messing rates paid. The Superintendent will allot the different bungalows in the exercise of his discretion, and under general instructions from the Chief Medical Officer.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of April, 1890, as altered by a further Order dated the 4th day of May, 1891, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Thomas Howel Kyflin Roberts as a District Auditor, and directed that, unless We should otherwise prescribe, it should be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the County Councils of the Counties named in paragraph (1) of Article I of the first-mentioned Order, including the said County of Essex, and the other Accounts referred to in paragraphs (2), (3), (4), and (5) of that Article, so far as the

same might be subject to audit by a District | form shall be the Form No. 73 in the Appendix Auditor, and might relate to a period prior to the 1st day of April, 1891; and We further directed that the District in which the said Thomas Howel Kyffin Roberts should act as Auditor for the performance of the duties assigned to him by the said Order, and which District was thereby assigned to him, should be termed "The Eastern and Midland Counties Audit District," and should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the Counties named in the said Orders;

And whereas the Accounts referred to in the said paragraph (5) of Article I of the Order first above-mentioned, the duty of auditing which was assigned to the District Auditor as aforesaid, included the Accounts of such of the Joint Committees including representatives of the County Council of one or more of the said Counties named in the Order and representatives of the County Councils of some other County or Counties, as We might by Order under Seal thereafter

prescribe;

And whereas by an Order made by the Board of Trade on the 5th day of May, 1890, under the Sea Fisheries Regulation Act, 1888, the Kent and Essex Sea Fisheries District has been created and a Local Fisheries Committee has been constituted for the regulation of the sea fisheries carried on within the District; and the Committee so constituted are a Joint Committee including representatives of the said County of Essex, within the said Eastern and Midland Counties Audit District, and of the County of Kent, which is not within that Audit District;

And whereas the said Fisheries Committee are a Joint Committee within the terms of paragraph (5) of Article I of the Order first abovementioned:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby order and prescribe that it shall, unless We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said Thomas Howel Kyffin Roberts to audit the Accounts of the said Fisheries Committee and of the Officers of such Committee in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the Order first above-mentioned, so far as such Accounts may relate to a period prior to the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one; and that for the purpose of such Audit the said Sea Fisheries District shall be deemed to be within the said Eastern and Midland Counties Audit District.

FORM OF STATEMENT OF RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS AND GENERAL DIRECTIONS AS TO STATEMENTS.

Size of Sheets.

(1.) Every statement must be on sheets 13 inches by 16 inches.

Form and contents of Statement.

(2.) Every statement must contain a detailed account of all the liquidator's realizations and disbursements in respect of the Company. The statement of realizations should contain a record of all receipts derived from assets existing at the date of the winding up order or resolution and subsequently realized, including balance in Bank, Book Debts and Calls Collected, Property Sold, &c.; and the account of disbursements should contain all payments for costs and charges, or to creditors, or contributories. Where property has been realized, the gross proceeds of sale must be entered under realizations, and the necessary payments incidental to sales must be entered as disbursements. These accounts should not contain payments into or out of Bank, or temporary investments by the liquidator, or the proceeds of such investments when realized, which should be shown separately:-

(a.) by means of the Bank Pass Book;

(b.) by a separate detailed statement of moneys invested, and investments realized.

Interest allowed or charged by the Bank, Bank Commission, &c., and profit or loss upon the realization of temporary investments, should, however, be inserted in the accounts of realizations or disbursements, as the case may be. Each receipt and payment must be entered in the account in such a manner as sufficiently to explain its nature. The receipts and payments must severally be added up at the foot of each sheet, and the totals carried forward from one account to another without any intermediate balance, so that the gross totals shall represent the total amounts received and paid by the liquidator respectively.

Trading Account.

(3.) When the liquidator carries on a business, a trading account must be forwarded as a distinct account, and the totals of receipts and payments on the trading account must alone be set out in the statement.

Dividends, &c.

(4.) When dividends or instalments of composition are paid to creditors, or a return of surplus assets is made to contributories, the total amount of each dividend, or instalment of composition, or payment to contributories, must be entered in the statement of disbursements as one sum; and the liquidator must forward separate accounts showing in lists the amount of the claim of each creditor, and the amount of dividend or composition payable to each creditor, and of surplus assets payable to each contributory, distinguishing in each list the dividends or instalments of composition and shares of surplus assets actually paid and those remaining unclaimed. Each list must be on sheets 13 inches by 8 inches.
