TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, all Parcels transmitted from Natal to any British Colony or Possession or any Foreign Country with which a Parcel Post is established via the United Kingdom shall be subject to the rates of postage respectively specified in Part II of the Schedule to and to the provi-

sions contained in the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, so far as such provisions are applicable to Parcels transmitted at the rates mentioned in Part II of the said Schedule and Part I of the Schedule to the said Warrant, and so much of such Warrant as relates thereto shall be repealed.

2. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

**GENERAL ORDER** of the Local Government Board. Temporary Infirmary: Regulations:—

Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, in the County of London;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of June, 1872, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington (amongst others), We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations for the government of the separate Infirmary of the said Parish, and the keeping of the Accounts relating thereto, and by the said Order, and by a further General Order dated the 2nd day of March, 1876, made provision with regard to the Officers and Assistants to be appointed for such Infirmary;

And whereas the said Guardians have, with Our approval, hired from the Poplar District Board of Works certain premises situate at Plaistow, in the County of Essex, to be used as a temporary Infirmary for the said Parish:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby order as follows:—

**ARTICLE I.** The Orders above-mentioned shall, so far as they are applicable to the said temporary Infirmary, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, apply to such Infirmary accordingly.

**ARTICLE II.** Notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Orders, every Officer or Assistant at the said temporary Infirmary shall be appointed for such term and at such salary or remuneration as the said Guardians may determine; but the particulars of every such appointment, including the name of the Officer or Assistant, the term for which he is appointed, and the salary or remuneration assigned to him, shall be reported to Us by the Clerk to the said Guardians as early as practicable.

**ARTICLE III.** Every such Officer or Assistant may be dismissed by the said Guardians at their discretion.

**ARTICLE IV.** The provisions contained in the above-mentioned Orders, and which are by Article I of this Order made applicable to the said temporary Infirmary, shall, as regards such Infirmary, be subject to any modification thereof

or departure therefrom to which on the application of the said Guardians We may assent.

**GENERAL ORDER** of the Local Government Board: Regulations as to Appointment of District Nurses by Guardians:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes for the time being in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General and other Orders the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and We, the Local Government Board, have from time to time prescribed Regulations in regard to the administration of relief in the several Unions and Separate Parishes in England and Wales, and as to the appointment, remuneration, and duties of Officers of such Unions and Separate Parishes;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Guardians should be empowered, subject to the Regulations hereinafter contained, to appoint Nurses to attend upon the Sick Poor relieved by the Guardians out of any Workhouse:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby order as follows:—

**ARTICLE I.**—The Guardians of the Poor of any Union or Separate Parish in England or Wales may from time to time as they may think fit, with Our approval, appoint one or more persons to act as Nurses or Nurses of the Sick Poor relieved by the Guardians out of any Workhouse, such persons to be termed District Nurses.

**ARTICLE II.**—The provisions in force in the Union or Separate Parish applicable to the mode of appointment, remuneration, and tenure of office of a Nurse at any Workhouse shall apply to any District Nurse appointed under the provisions of this Order.

**ARTICLE III.**—No person shall be appointed to the office of District Nurse who has not undergone, for one year at the least, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of a Hospital or Infirmary being a Training School for Nurses and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon.

**ARTICLE IV.**—The duties to be performed by a District Nurse shall be—

1. To attend duly and punctually as a nurse upon any poor person or persons in receipt of medical relief when directed by the Guardians, or upon receipt of a written or printed order from any Relieving Officer in any case in which such officer may be authorized, by regulations to be prescribed by the Guardians, to give such order.
2. To obey any directions of the District Medical Officer in attendance upon any poor person in regard to the nursing and treatment of such person.
3. To keep a record, in such form and containing such particulars as may be prescribed by the Guardians, in regard to cases which she attends.

4. To perform such other duties in relation to her office as the Guardians may from time to time direct.

ARTICLE V.—No District Nurse shall undertake the duties of a midwife.

ARTICLE VI.—Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Guardians of any Union or Separate Parish by whom any District Nurse is appointed under this Order shall make Regulations in regard to—

1. The duties of a District Nurse.
2. The duties of any District Medical Officer or Relieving Officer in relation to the office of District Nurse or to any person holding that office.
3. Any other matters which may from time to time appear necessary for the efficient performance of the duties of any District Nurse.

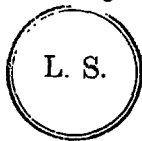
ARTICLE VII.—In this Order—

The word "Union" includes any Union of Parishes incorporated or united for the relief or maintenance of the Poor under any Act of Parliament;

The term "Separate Parish" means a Parish or Place which is under a separate Board of Guardians;

The expression "Guardians of the Poor" includes any Governors, Directors, Acting Guardians, Vestrymen, or other Officers appointed or entitled to act in the distribution or ordering of relief to the Poor from the Poor Rates under any Act of Parliament.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Consolidated Order): Prohibiting Admission of Small-Pox Cases to the Workhouse:—

Dewsbury Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Dewsbury Union, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Places comprised in the said Union;—

To the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and the Master and Matron of the Workhouse thereof;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the said Dewsbury Union are in possession of a Workhouse, including an Infirmary and detached Infectious Wards, situate in the Townships of Dewsbury and Batley;

And whereas it is expedient that persons suffering from Small-Pox should not be admitted into the said Workhouse:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We hereby prohibit the said Guardians from granting any Order for the admission into the said Workhouse of any person suffering from Small-Pox, and We prohibit the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and any Overseer of any parish or place therein, from granting any such Order; and the Master,

Matron, or other Officer of the said Workhouse from admitting into the said Workhouse any person suffering as aforesaid.

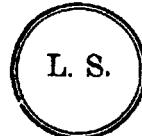
By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
