

4. To perform such other duties in relation to her office as the Guardians may from time to time direct.

ARTICLE V.—No District Nurse shall undertake the duties of a midwife.

ARTICLE VI.—Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Guardians of any Union or Separate Parish by whom any District Nurse is appointed under this Order shall make Regulations in regard to—

1. The duties of a District Nurse.
2. The duties of any District Medical Officer or Relieving Officer in relation to the office of District Nurse or to any person holding that office.
3. Any other matters which may from time to time appear necessary for the efficient performance of the duties of any District Nurse.

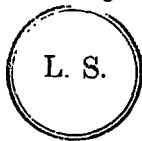
ARTICLE VII.—In this Order—

The word "Union" includes any Union of Parishes incorporated or united for the relief or maintenance of the Poor under any Act of Parliament;

The term "Separate Parish" means a Parish or Place which is under a separate Board of Guardians;

The expression "Guardians of the Poor" includes any Governors, Directors, Acting Guardians, Vestrymen, or other Officers appointed or entitled to act in the distribution or ordering of relief to the Poor from the Poor Rates under any Act of Parliament.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Consolidated Order): Prohibiting Admission of Small-Pox Cases to the Workhouse:—

Dewsbury Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Dewsbury Union, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Places comprised in the said Union;—

To the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and the Master and Matron of the Workhouse thereof;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the said Dewsbury Union are in possession of a Workhouse, including an Infirmary and detached Infectious Wards, situate in the Townships of Dewsbury and Batley;

And whereas it is expedient that persons suffering from Small-Pox should not be admitted into the said Workhouse:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We hereby prohibit the said Guardians from granting any Order for the admission into the said Workhouse of any person suffering from Small-Pox, and We prohibit the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and any Overseer of any parish or place therein, from granting any such Order; and the Master,

Matron, or other Officer of the said Workhouse from admitting into the said Workhouse any person suffering as aforesaid.

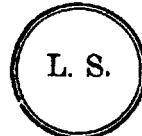
By the Board of Agriculture.
