(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the whole of the premises at No. 96, Little Albany-street, near Regent's Park, in the county of London, in the occupation of Mr. R. H. Newman,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

(8.) A small patch, with 7½ fathoms water on it, lies in lat. 12° 49' 45" S., long. 45° 1' 10" E.
