By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the date of this Order it shall not be lawful for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed to or from any port in England or Wales or Scotland animals taken on board for the purpose of importation in or on the steamship *Fanø* now owned by the United Steamship Company of Copenhagen, for the period of three months from the date of this Order and such conveyance of animals by that vessel is for such period prohibited accordingly.

2. If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1891 or in any Order declaring a Pleuro-Pneumonia Scheduled District no cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Districts or Parts of Districts of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order without a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture or by a person appointed for the purpose by the Board, which licence will only be granted where the Board after inquiry are satisfied that exceptional
