THE ISLE OF SHEPPEY (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vestel under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the part of the district of the Local Authority for the county of Kent described in the Schedule to this Order.

2. (i.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into the part of the district of the Local Authority for the county of Kent described in the Schedule to this Order otherwise than in accordance with the following provisions:

(ii.) Cattle, sheep, or swine may be moved into the said part by rail for slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the county of Kent.

(iii.) All cattle, sheep, or swine so moved into the said part shall be slaughtered within fortyeight hours of such movement.

3. (i.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person
