(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the cowsheds and other premises at No. 88, Back Church-lane, St. George's-in-the-East, in the county of London, in the occupation of Mr. William Lambeth,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

A Place comprising all that Sale-yard in the occupation of Messrs. J. Swan and Sons, situate near the Haymarket Railway Station, in the burgh of Edinburgh.

ISLE OF WIGHT (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Order of the Board dated the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, prohibiting the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of a District comprising the county of Southampton and the boroughs of Bournemouth, Portsmouth, Southampton, and Winchester, any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine landed from the Isle of Wight at any place in the county of Southampton or in the borough of Portsmouth or in the borough of Southampton may be moved out of the said District on the following conditions:

- (a.) When landed the animals shall be moved forthwith by the most direct available route to the nearest available railway station on the line of railway by which the animals are to be moved to their place of destination; and
- (b.) The animals shall be kept at such railway station until trucked, and shall be then moved by rail to the place of destination without untrucking.

2. If any head of cattle, or a sheep, or a goat, or a pig, landed from the Isle of Wight at any place in the county of Southampton or in the borough of Portsmouth or in the borough of Southampton, is moved out of the said District in contravention of the foregoing conditions, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the movement of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine into the District of any Local Authority in contravention of any Regulation made by that Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District from the District of the Local Authority of the Isle of Wight.

4. This Order may be cited as the ISLE OF WIGHT (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1892.
