THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order of the Board dated the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, prohibiting the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of a District comprising the petty sessional divisions of Brentwood, Epping, Ongar, and Orsett, and the liberty of Havering-atte-Bower, in the county of Essex, a cow the property of Messrs. Sturgeon and Sons, of Grays Hall, Grays, Essex, may be placed in a barge on the river Thames at Grays and be taken in such barge to the East India Docks to be there transferred to the Royal Mail Steamer "Hawarden Castle" for exportation.

METROPOLITAN MARKET (MOVEMENT OF LAMBS) ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Lambs to Metropolitan Cattle Market for Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the several Orders mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order, lambs intended for slaughter may be moved out of any of the Districts and parts of Districts of Local Authorities described in the Second Schedule to this Order to the Metropolitan Market on the following conditions, and not otherwise:

- (i.) The lambs shall be accompanied with a Movement Licence as hereinafter provided, and such Licence shall be delivered to the officer of the Metropolitan Market appointed to receive the same on the arrival of the lambs at the Metropolitan Market;
- (ii.) The Movement Licence shall be a Licence of the Local Authority of the District from which the lambs are to be moved, and shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect, and shall be granted only on such a Declaration as hereinafter provided;
- (iii.) The Declaration shall be a Declaration of the owner of the lambs or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose declaring that the lambs to be moved have been in the possession of the owner, and have been exclusively grazed or otherwise fed on the premises from which they are to be moved, for a period of at least twenty-one days immediately before the making of the Declaration, and that the said lambs have not during that period been in any market, fair, sale-yard, or place of exhibition, and have not at any time during that period been at any place situate within two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, and have not to the best of his knowledge and belief been in any way exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease;
- (iv.) The lambs moved under the provisions of this Order shall be moved by railway only, and shall be trucked at the nearest available railway station to the place from which they are moved, and shall be untrucked at the railway station which is the nearest of those available to the Metropolitan Market, and shall be forthwith moved from the last-mentioned station by the nearest available route to the Metropolitan Market.

Granting of Movement Licences.

2.—(1.) A Local Authority may if they think fit withhold a Movement Licence in any case where the movement of the lambs proposed to be
