

moved would be in their judgment inexpedient or improper.

(2.) No Licence for movement of lambs to the Metropolitan Market granted under this Order shall be available if granted by the owner of the lambs to be moved or by his agent, or by the consignee, or by the person selling the lambs or exposing the lambs for sale, or by the occupier of the farm or premises from which the lambs are to be moved.

Delivery of Declarations.

3.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Movement Licence under this Order, shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Movement Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Every person in charge of lambs being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a lamb is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the lamb, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or per-

mitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the lamb, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a lamb being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as THE METROPOLITAN MARKET (MOVEMENT OF LAMBS) ORDER OF 1892.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall commence and take effect on and after this tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order—
The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Metropolitan Market means the Metropolitan Cattle Market at Islington in the county of London, and includes the lairs and slaughter-houses adjacent thereto, being the property of the Corporation of the city of London:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Districts and Parts of Districts of Local Authorities referred to in Article 1 of this Order.

The county of Kent (except the Poor Law Union of the Isle of Sheppey, comprising the parishes of Eastchurch, Isle of Elmley, Isle of Harty, Leysdown, Minster in Sheppey, Queenborough, and Warden; and except such portion of the county as is within the Metropolitan Police District; and except the parishes of Blean, Cheriton, and Newington-next-Hythe).

The Eastern and the Western Divisions of Sussex (except the parishes of Ashurst, and Cuckfield).

The county of Southampton.

The county of Surrey (except such portion thereof as is within the Metropolitan Police District; and except the parish of Ash).
