

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Francis William Leyborne Popham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Arthur Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Brislington now vested in the said Francis William Leyborne Popham and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid shall be transferred from the said Francis William Leyborne Popham and from his heirs and assigns to the said Arthur Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells as such Bishop and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the eleventh day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of the Manor of Peopleton in the county of Worcester and of certain lands situate and tithe rent-charge arising in the parish of Peopleton and now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the twelfth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one and made or expressed to be made between Mary Bomford of Pitchill in the parish of Salford Priors in the county of Warwick Widow of the first part John Parker of Woodside near the city of Worcester Esquire of the second part and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part the manor lands and tithe rent-charge described in the schedule hereto annexed situate and arising in Peopleton in the county of Worcester became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the said manor lands and tithe rent-charge are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said manor lands and tithe rent-charge or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such manor lands and tithe rent-charge or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said manor lands and tithe rent-charge so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithe rent-charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed and in the meantime to invest the proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.
