in manner prescribed by the Valuation (Metro- i Kent, may be moved out of the said District to a Farm called Ruxley, Foots Cray, Kent, situate within the Metropolitan Police District.

2. This Order shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
