The observation of seven days, ordered by the Government Circular No. 9356 of October 21, 1891, for arrivals from the coast between Mersina and Jaffa, will be replaced by rigorous medical inspection, and such inspection will be applied from this date to all arrivals from the coast between Adalia and Jaffa, both those ports included.
