## TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 12th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £750,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 19th April, 1892, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz. :—on the 19th July, 1892, or 19th October, 1892, or 19th April, 1893, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 13th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Tuesday, the 19th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ORDER of the Local Government Board. Alteration of General Order. Election of Guardians, 1892:—

Shaftesbury Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Shaftesbury Union, in the County of Dorset;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, addressed (amongst others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Shaftesbury Union, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed the manner of conducting the Election of Guardians of the Poor for the several Parishes comprised in that Union, and by Article 23 of that Order directed that certain duties in connection with the Election should be performed by the Returning Officer at the Board Room of the Guardians;

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said General Order as hereinafter-mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I. For the purposes of the Election of

Guardians of the Poor of the said Shaftesbury Union for the year ending the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the Returning Officer shall perform the several duties specified in Article 23 of the above-cited General Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, at the Town Hall, Shaftesbury, instead of at the Board Room of the said Guardians:

ARTICLE II. Notice of the alteration made by Article I of this Order shall be affixed to the principal external gate or door of the Workhouse of the Union, and on such places in every Parish as are ordinarily made use of for affixing thereon notices of parochial business.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Allowance of Tobacco and Snuff to certain Paupers in the Workhouse:—

Seven Oaks Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Seven Oaks Union, in the County of Kent;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Seven Oaks Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Seven Oaks Union, namely,—

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed to such of the inmates of the Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the Workhouse without the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, so far as regards the said Union; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.
