or premises therein may enter the said Infected | shed, or other place while any cattle, sheep, or Place subject to the following conditions:
(a.) Every such person before leaving the

Infected Place shall disinfect his boots with

a solution of carbolic acid; and

(b.) Every such person if accompanied by a horse or vehicle shall disinfect the feet of such horse and the wheels of such vehicle with a solution of carbolic acid before allowing such horse or vehicle to leave the Infected Place.

Regulations as to Dogs in Infected Place.

2. No person shall allow-

(a.) any dog to enter the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to this Order; or

(b.) any dog to be at large in or to leave the said Infected Place.

Previsions of this Order to be in addition to, and not in substitution of, Existing Provisions.

3. The provisions of this Order are in addition to, and not in substitution of, any existing Rules or Regulations relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places under the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890 or any Order thereunder.

Offences.

- 4.—(1.) If any person enters the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to this Order in contravention of this Order, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.
- (2.) If the owner or person in charge of any dog permits such dog to enter or to be at large in or to leave the said Infected Place in contravention of this Order, such owner or person shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected

with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. Notwithstanding the existence of any footpaths or right of way across or through any field, shed, or other place in the Infected Area declared by this Order, no person shall enter such field, I

swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agri-

culture.

3. No dog shall be allowed to be at large within the Infected Area declared by this Order except while being used for the driving of cattle or sheep.

- 4.—(1.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.
- (2.) If the owner or person in charge of any dog permits such dog to be at large in contravention of this Order, such owner or person shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act,
- 5. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
