THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

#### MOVEMENT FROM METROPOLITAN MARKET ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture any head of cattle or any sheep or any pig which has been sold or exposed for sale at the Metropolitan Cattle Market at Islington, in the county of London, may be moved from the said Market and out of the county of London to any place situate within any of the Districts or parts of Districts of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order for the purpose of being there slaughtered, with a Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the place is situate first obtained.

2. Every animal so moved shall be slaughtered

within four days after its arrival at the Market, and in no case shall any such animal be moved out of the Metropolitan Police District.

3.—(1.) If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(2.) If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

4. This Order may be cited as THE MOVEMENT FROM METROPOLITAN MARKET ORDER OF 1892.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
