THE following scheme for the adjustment of the property rights liabilities &c. of the Local Board for the Local Government District of South Stockton (in connection with the grant of a Municipal Charter of Incorporation to Thornaby-on-Tees) and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882:—

"Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the township of Thornaby in the administrative county of the North Riding of York, in the month of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Local Government District of South Stockton hereinafter described and the portion of the township of Thornaby which is not contained in the said Local Government District of South Stockton a Municipal Borough, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

".And whereas the said Local Board District and the said remaining portion of the township of Thornaby together comprise the whole of the said township

"And whereas the said remaining portion of

the township of Thornaby is part of the district of and for which the Guardians of the Poor of the Middlesbrough Union in the North Riding of the county of York are the Rural Sanitary Authority.

"And whereas by an Order dated the seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, under the hand of Sir George Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Local Government Act, 1858, the District of South Stockton was constituted a District for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

"And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and confirmed by 'The Local Government Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1874, (No. 3)' the District of the Local Board was extended for all sanitary purposes so as to include parts of the Rural Sanitary District of the Stockton Union in the county of Durham, and in the North Riding of the county of York, more particularly described and comprised within the boundaries set out in the schedule thereto.

"And whereas by the Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act 1876 the Company and Proprietors of the Stockton Middlesbrough and Yarm Waterworks were required to sell their Waterworks Undertaking to the Corporations of

Stockton and Middlesbrough.

" And whereas by 'The Stockton Bridge Act, 1881, a Joint Committee was established and appointed for putting such Act into execution; and the said Committee were authorized to construct a new bridge across the River Tees with approach roads and works connected therewith, with power to the promoters to borrow such moneys as might be required for the purposes of the Act and to secure the repayment thereof by mortgage of their respective funds and rates; and it was by the said Act among other things provided that the Local Board for the District of South Stockton might from time to time borrow and re-borrow at interest such moneys as they might require for the payment of the contributions payable by such Local Board under such Act and subject to the provisions therein contained and that the moneys so borrowed or reborrowed should be charged on the District Fund and General District Rates of the district of the said Local Board.

"And whereas the said Stockton Bridge Act 1881 was amended by a Provisional Order confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act 1883. "And whereas by the South Stockton Local Board (Water) Act, 1884, the said Local Board were empowered to acquire from the Corporation of Stockton one sixth part of their interest in the said Waterworks Undertaking and for such purpose were authorized to borrow not exceeding one hundred and sixty thousand pounds and to secure the same by mortgage of the Water Revenue and their District Fund and General District Rate.

"And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-eighth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in pursuance of the powers given by 'The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876,' as amended and extended by 'The Poor Law Act, 1879,' the Local Government Board ordered that the portion of the town and borough of Stockton which was situated to the south of the middle of the River Tees, and was otherwise bounded by the townships of Thornaby, Linthorpe, and Stainton, should cease to be part of the said township and borough of Stockton and county of Durham, and should be amalgamated with the township of Thornaby and form part of the North Riding of the county of York, and that the said Order should take effect on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

"And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board dated the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, ordered that a Joint Board should be formed as therein mentioned and should be permanently constituted the Port Sanitary Authority for the Ports of Middlesbrough and Stockton, and that the expenses incurred by the said Port Sanitary Authority should be contributed by the authorities therein mentioned including the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of South Stockton and exempting from such expenses the Rural Sanitary District of the Middlesbrough

"And whereas the said Order of the second January, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix, was amended by a further Order of the Local Government Board dated June thirty one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

"And whereas by 'The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1888,' the said Local Board were authorized to borrow on the security of the Water Revenue and their District Fund and General District Rate, in addition to the powers given by the Act of 1884, further sums of one thousand one hundred and fifty-five pounds and four thousand pounds together with such sum as might be required for the purposes of defraying their proportion of the costs, charges, and expenses of obtaining and passing that Act.

"And whereas by a Local Act of Parliament passed in the fifty-third and fifty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts relating to the supply of water by the Stockton and Middlesbrough Water Board, and to confer further powers on the said Board, and for other purposes, herein called 'The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1890,' the Local Board were authorized to borrow on the security of the Water Revenue and their District Fund and General District Rate, in addition to the sums authorized by the Acts of 1884 and 1888, a sum not exceeding thirty-two thousand six hundred and ninety pounds together with such sum as might be required for the purposes of defraying their proportion of the

costs, charges, and expenses of obtaining and passing of the said Act.

"And whereas under and in pursuance of the said Stockton Bridge Act, 1881, the Local Board have paid to the Joint Committee for executing that Act the sum of sixteen thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, which amount has been borrowed by the Local Board on the security of their District Fund and General District Rate, and provision was made for the repayment of the money so borrowed by way of annuity, and fifteen thousand six hundred and fifty-eight pounds ten shillings and four pence part of the said sum of sixteen thousand two hundred and fifty pounds the repayment whereof is so charged upon the District Fund and the General District Rates of the district of South Stockton is still outstanding and unpaid.

"And whereas under and in pursuance of the Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Acts, 1884, 1888, and 1890, the said Local Board have borrowed the sum of one hundred and thirty-one thousand pounds the repayment whereof, with interest, is charged upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the said district of South Stockton for the purposes of the said Acts and provision was made for repayment thereof by way of annuity.

"And whereas one hundred and twenty-seven thousand and twelve pounds eight shillings and eight pence part of the said sum of one hundred and thirty-one thousand pounds so charged upon the District Fund and General District Rates of the said district of South Stockton is still outstanding and unpaid.

"And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer, and vesting of the Bridge and Water Undertakings of the Local Board and other property, rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or acquired under the Acts of 1881, 1883, 1884, 1888, and 1890 as by this scheme mentioned.

"And whereas under and by virtue of the Burial Act 1853, and the Acts amending the same, a Burial Board was appointed for the parish of Thornaby the area whereof is coextensive with the area of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees.

"And whereas under and by virtue of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and the various Acts amending the same, a School Board was formed for the School District of the township of Thornaby, hereinafter called the Thornaby Township School Board and District respectively, the area whereof is coextensive with the area of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees.

"And whereas the Local Board are the Urban Sanitary Authority for their said district of South Stockton as extended as aforesaid and the Guardians of the Poor of the Middlesbrough Union, in the said North Riding of the county of York, are the Rural Sanitary Authority for amongst other places the said remaining portion of the township of Thornaby and such Urban Sanitary Authority and Rural Sanitary Authority and the Burial Board and the School Board are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 and of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1885.

"And whereas this scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department to the Local Government Board and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

" And whereas it is expedient that a scheme

should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

"Now therefore pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

" Short Title.

"1. This scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees Scheme, 1892.

" Commencement of Scheme.

"2. This scheme shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. 'This date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this scheme.' So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

" Sanitary Authority.

"3. The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this scheme and thenceforward be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees, acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

" Local Board Abolished.

"4. The Local Board for the district of South Stockton, and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough; and the said Local Board shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to, and * exercise, the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this scheme the Local Board and their district shall be hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

" Alteration of Rural Sanitary District.

"5. The portion of the township of Thornaby which was not comprised in the Local Government District of South Stockton (hereinaster called the 'Rural Portion of Thornaby') shall continue and be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this scheme to form and be part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Middlesbrough Union as if the Charter had not been granted, and from and after the commencement of this scheme the rural portion of Thornaby shall cease to form part of the said Rural Sanitary District, and the Guardians of the said Union shall cease to be the Sanitary Authority for the portion of Thornaby and to have any power duties rights or obligations in respect of the same.

Transfer of Jurisdiction, Property, &c., of Local Board,

"6. All the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the Local Board, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the said Local Board, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this scheme), shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said borough.

"7. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this scheme attached to and were enforceable against the said Local Board, or the property thereof, shall attach to, and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees.

"8. Any investigation, legal proceedings, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Local Board before the commencement of this scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees.

"9. The term 'property' in this scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights, and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"10. The district fund and the general district rate of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees, shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and general district rate respectively of the Local Board, and all sums of money respectively payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said district fund or general district rate shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon the said district fund and general district rate leviable in the said borough respectively.

"11. With respect to the hereinbefore recited Acts and the Orders of the Local Government. Board relating respectively to the Stockton Bridge, to the supply of water, and to the Port Sanitary Authority for the Ports of Stockton and Middlesbrough, and to any acts matters and things to be done thereunder the following provisions shall have effect:

"(1.) The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees acting by the Council shall be substituted for the Local Board, and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties and liabilities, vested in devolving upon, or exerciseable by the said Local Board shall be transferred to, vested in devolve, upon and be exerciseable by and shall be enforceable against the said Mayor. Aldermen, and Burgesses.

against the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses. "(2.) The Town Clerk of the borough of Thornaby on-Tees shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the Local Board.

"(3.) All existing bye-laws, regulations, lists of fees and charges, made under the authority of any of the said Acts shall continue in force until repealed or varied.

"(4.) No act done, or purporting to be done under the Authority of such Acs or Orders

between the date of the commencement of this Scheme and its confirmation by Parliament or by Order in Council (as the case may be), shall be invalidated by this Scheme, but such act shall be and continue to be valid if the same would have been valid but for the operation of this Scheme.

"12. All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations, and liabilities whatsoever of the South Stockton Local Board acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority of the District of South Stockton, and of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Middlesbrough Union in respect of the rural portion of Thornaby under or by virtue of the following Acts, namely, the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Act amending or extending the same, the Sanitary Acts as defined by the Public Health Act, 1875, and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar to those of the aforesaid Acts, shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exerciseable by and shall be enforceable against the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said Borough.

Bye-Laws.

"13. The Bye-laws and Regulations of the South Stockton Local Board, and the Bye-laws of the Guardians of the Middlesbrough Union, acting as the Rural Sanitary Authority, shall, until the same are repealed or varied as respects the said borough of Thornaby-on-Tees by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority in the said borough, continue in force and be enforced within the borough as follows:—

"(1.)—(a) The existing Bye-laws made by the Rural Sanitary Authority with respect to new streets and buildings, nuisances, the cleansing of footways and pavements, the removal of house refuse, and the cleansing of earth closets, privies, ashpits, and cesspools, and the regulation of common lodging-houses in the contributory place of Thornaby, and

"(b) The existing Bye-laws made by the Local Board as to slaughter-houses and hackney car-

riages, and

Board under the Dairies and Milkshops Order,

shall apply to the whole borough, substituting only the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses acting as aforesaid and their officers for the Local Board and Rural Sanitary Authority and their officers respectively.

respectively.

"Provided that the aforesaid Bye-laws as to slaughter-houses and hackney carriages shall, unless the same be sooner repealed or varied, cease to have effect from and after the expiration of one year from the commencement of this Scheme.

"(2.) All other Byc-laws made by the said Local Board shall, from and after the commencement of this Scheme, be repealed, but without prejudice to any rights or liabilities acquired or incurred thereunder.

Burial Board.

"14. With respect to the Burial Board the following provisions shall have effect:

"(1.) From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Burial Board shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

"(2.) The Council of the borough of Thornabyon-Tees shall be substituted for the said Burial Board, and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, duties, and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exerciseable by the said Board shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exerciseable by, and shall be enforceable against the said Council of the borough, and the Council shall be the Burial Board for and within the said borough.

"(3.) The clerk, officers, and servants of the Burial Board shall become the clerk, officers, and servants respectively of the Council of the borough acting as the Burial Board of the said borough.

"(4.) The borough rate shall be substituted for the poor rate of the parish of Thornaby, and all sums of money respectively payable to from or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to, the said poor rate shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon and attach to the borough rate.

"(5.) All regulations as to fees, charges, and payments made by the Burial'Board and in force at the commencement of this Scheme, shall continue in force until the same are repealed or

varied by the Council of the borough.

School Board.

"15.—(1.) The Thornaby School Board shall be the School Board for the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees by the name of the Thornaby-on-Tees Borough School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Thornaby School Board by the Education Department, the borough of Thornaby-on-Tees had been a Municipal Borough. Everything in connection with the said Board shall be done had and construed accordingly.

"(2.) All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the Thornaby School Board immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Thornaby-on-Tees Borough School Board and all charges charged on the School fund and in respect of liabilities of the Thornaby School Board on the Poor Rate of the township of Thornaby-on-Tees immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged upon the School fund of the Thornaby-on-Tees Borough School Board and upon the borough rate or fund of the said borough and not otherwise.

"(3.) Any bye-laws made by the Thornaby School Board, under the Acts relating to public elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Thornaby-on-Tees Borough School District.

"(4.) Any act done by the Education Department or the said Thornaby School Board or the Council of the said borough or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done if the said Department, School Board, Council or Justice might have lawfully done the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said borough.

Loans.

"16. No part of the principal or interest of the loans described in the Schedule to this Scheme shall be charged upon or be payable in respect of premises in the rural portion of Thornaby.

Limitation of Rate in Rural Portion of Thornaby.

"17. In making assessing and levying general district rates within the said borough, such district rates upon tithes, land, and other property in the rural portion of Thornaby which, under the Public Health Act 1875 and the Acts amending the same are directed to be assessed in the proportion of one-fourth only of their net annual

value shall not exceed one shilling in the pound in any one year for a term of twenty years; and the owners and occupiers of all existing houses and houses to be hereafter erected in the said rural portion of Thornaby shall pay one-third only of their full assessment to the general district rate upon the gross annual value thereof for a term of twenty years, such terms respectively to commence upon the day of the first meeting of the Council of the borough.

Savings for Rates, &c.

"18. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to, or with reference to the Local Board, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against, and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the Local Board, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of such Board had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

Compensation for Existing Officers.

"19. In case any officer of the Local Board, or of any of the public bodies for whom the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees or the Council of the said Borough are respectively substituted who shall have been employed by the said Local Board or by any of the said public bodies as the case may be shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, such officer shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Lords Commissioners in awarding the said compensation, shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service, in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided, nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said council and discharged by thom (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term 'officer' shall include any persons employed by the Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

"20. The Accounts of the Local Board and their Officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any Regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of the Local Boards and of their Officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Local Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at any audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Local Board for the District of Torquay and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:-

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (in the said Acts, and in this scheme, referred to as the 'Committee of Council') and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Town and Local Government District of Torquay, in the county of Devon, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of

a Charter of Incorporation.

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said town within the limits set forth in the Charter in that behalf a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

"And whereas under and by virtue of a Provisional Order made by the General Board of Health under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1850, and dated the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty and thereafter confirmed by the Public Health Supplemental Act 1850 (No. 3) a Local Board of Health was constituted for the district of Tormoham, in the

county of Devon.

"And whereas under and by virtue of the said last recited Act and Order the powers of certain Commissioners established under an Act of Parliament passed in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five and intituled 'An Act for lighting, watching and improving the parish of Tormoham in the county of Devon' were transferred to the said Local Board.

"And whereas the said Local Board is an Urban Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Public Health Act 1875, and is commonly known as the Local Board of Health for the District of Torquay (hereinafter referred to as the Local Board), and their District is commonly known as the District of Torquay.

"And whereas under and by virtue of the Torquay Harbour and District Act, 1886, the Local Board was given various powers concerning matters relating to public health and local government within the District of Torquay and were empowered to make Bye-laws and to borrow upon the security of the district fund and general district rate of the said District of Torquay.

"And whereas by the Torquay Harbour and District Act 1886 (49 and 50 Victoria cap. 119), and by the Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade known as the Torquay Harbour Order, 1888, confirmed by the Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1888 (51 and 52 Vic. cap. 170), and by a Provisional Order of the Board of Trade made on the twentieth April, 1892, the Torquay Local Board were empowered to purchase, and afterwards maintain the Har-! as in the said Order is defined.

bour undertaking, consisting of the Torquay Harbours with the foreshore bed of the sea and all the undertaking and works authorized by the Torquay Harbour Act of 43 Geo. III, and by the Torquay Harbour Orders 1864 and 1868, and all rates tolls dues and monies thereby authorized to be levied, and also the sheds, cranes, moorings, buoys, rails and other moveable plant, stores, conveniences, buildings and requirements connected with such Harbour as a going concern, and were also empowered to purchase certain buildings, stores, offices, works, and conveniences on and adjacent to the new harbour and quay, also certain buildings stores on and adjacent to the old harbour and quays; also the Bath Saloons with the ladies' bathing cove, including machinery, fixtures and plant, also the Custom House, and divers lands, houses, shops, and other buildings, gardens, pleasure grounds, shelters, quarries, timber and trees and other property, and to make new streets, and to erect a new Town Hall and offices, and the powers of the said Board as to raising money on the security of the Harbour district Fund, general district fund, and district rates, and as to the making of piers and quays, and execution of other works, improvement of the harbour, establishment of ferries, levying of tolls, taking rates and dues, making of bye-laws, and in other respects were much enlarged, and divers powers were conferred thereby upon the said Board; and it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer and vesting, and management of the Harbour undertaking of the Local Board, and other the property, rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or acquired under the said Orders and Acts, as by this Scheme mentioned.

"And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the Torquay Water Works Act 1856, and of the Provisional Orders made by one of the

principal Secretaries of State, and the Local Government Board, and confirmed by the Confirmation Acts respectively, and which said Orders and Acts are set out in the schedule hereto, the. Torquay Local Board is possessed of Water Works, Lands, Reservoirs, and other property, and has undertaken to supply and does supply water within the Local Government District

aforesaid, and also in the towns of Newton Bushel and Newton Abbot, and the parishes of Highweek, Wolborough, St. Marychurch, and Cockington, all in the county of Devon, but without the said district, and supplies water within the limits

for water supply in the said Acts defined, and for

that purpose has acquired, provided, and laid down lands, water works, reservoirs, mains, pipes, meters, and apparatus, and the said Board has power to make rates and to borrow money on the security of the same, and to make bye-laws, and the said Board has divers other powers, authori-

ties, obligations, privileges, and duties, and it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer to, and vesting in the Urban Sanitary Authority of the said borough of the water and other undertakings of the said Board,

and of all the property, rights, powers, authori-

ties, obligations, privileges, and duties aforesaid. "And whereas under the Provisional Order of 1882, made by the Local Government Board and. the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1882, certain powers. were conferred on the Torquay Local Board for making bye-laws and regulating public bathing on the sea shore of Torquay, with powers to extend same, not only to the Beach and shore within. the district of the said Board, but also to the Beach and shore within the parish of Cockington,

"And whereas the Torquay Local Board have entered into special agreements with the neighbouring parishes of St. Marychurch and Cockington, in the county of Devon, as to the disposal of sewage, and have also entered into special agreements with various local authorities and individuals for supply of water outside the district of the said Board, but within the County of Devon.

"And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer to and vesting in the Urban Sanitary Authority of the said Borough of all property rights powers authorities obligations privileges and duties conferred by or acquired under the said last-mentioned Order and

Act and agreements.

"And whereas by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act 1891 the Torquay Local Board were empowered to supply electrical energy as therein defined by the Electric Lighting Act 1882.

"And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board made on the twenty-sixth April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, the Torquay Local Board were empowered to purchase and take certain lands described in the Schedule to the said Order.

"And whereas notice of the said Petition for a Charter of Incorporation was given to the Devonshire County Council, and was also sent to the Local Government Board, and the Local Government Act 1888 was otherwise duly com-

plied with.

"And whereas this scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Local Government Board, and the Board of Trade.

"And whereas the Local Board is a local authority within the meaning of part XI of the

Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth. Now, therefore, pursuant to the said Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions hereinafter set forth and do hereby order, direct, and declare as follows:—

"Short Title.

"1. This scheme may be cited for all purposes as 'The Borough of Torquay Scheme, 1892.'

"Commencement of Scheme.

"2. This scheme shall come and be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough, created by the Charter above referred to, and shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or by Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this scheme.' So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

"Interpretation.

"3. In this scheme the expression 'the Charter' shall mean the said Charter creating the Municipal Borough of Torquay. The expression 'the Borough' shall mean the said Borough of Torquay, created by the said Charter. The expression 'the Local Government District' shall mean the Local Government District of Torquay, as it existed at the date of the said Charter.

"The expression 'The Harbour Undertaking' shall mean the rights, powers, duties, and liabilities of the Local Board under and by virtue of such of the hereinbefore recited Acts and Provisional Orders as relate to Piers and Harbours.

"The expression 'property' shall mean and include all property, whether real or personal, and all rights and interests, legal or equitable connected therewith, or in respect thereof, and all choses in action and all water rates, and all other rates, and all rights legal or equitable connected therewith, or in respect thereof, and all charters, deeds, books, writings, and documents, and all rights and claims to any legal or equitable relief.

" Sanitary Authority.

"4. The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed immediately on and after the commencement of this scheme, and thenceforward within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay, acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

"Local Board abolished.

"5. The Torquay Local Board, its powers, duties, obligations, and privileges shall continue to exist until the commencement of this scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough, and the said Local Board shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to and exercise the said powers, duties, obligations, and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this scheme, shall be deemed to have been as validly and effectually done or omitted to be done as if no such Charter had been granted. Immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme, the said Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

"6. All the jurisdiction, powers, duties and property (whether within or without the district of Torquay) vested in or possessed by the Local Board, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this scheme), shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

"7. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Local Board or its property, shall attach to, and be enforceable against the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the

Borough of Torquay.

"8. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any property, obligation, debt, liability or forfeiture, vested in or attaching to, or due to, or incurred by or on behalf of the Local Board, before the commencement of this scheme, may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay.

"9. The Harbour Undertaking of the Torquay Local Board, and the foreshore, fundus, or bed of the sea, works, piers quays wharves buildings breakwaters, Townhall and offices, shelters drinking fountains, bath saloons, Custom House, dwelling-houses, shops, offices, stores and buildings, lands, pleasure grounds, gardens, reclaimed lands, quarries and all other property, whether

real or personal, and works connected therewith, and whether within or without the Borough, and all the powers authorities rights duties capacities liabilities obligations and interests held possessed enjoyed acquired or exercisable by belonging attaching to or vested in the Local Board under the Torquay Harbour and District Act 1886 and the Orders and Acts therein recited or mentioned, and under the Torquay Harbour Order 1888 and the Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1888 and under the Provisional Order of the Board of Trade of the 20th April 1892, or any of them shall pass to be exerciseable by attach to and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the borough. . Every reference in the said Orders and Acts and any contract thereto scheduled as altered by any General or Local Act before the commencement of this scheme to the Local Board its members officers servants or district shall be and shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay, acting by the Council as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, and to its members officers servants and the Borough of Torquay. Every contract and contractual engagement entered into by or with the Local Board under or by virtue of the said Acts or Orders or any of them shall be deemed to have been entered into by or with the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay as such Sanitary Authority.

"10. All the powers, authorities, duties, obligations, liabilities, privileges, rights, property, interest, waterworks, lands, reservoirs, buildings, offices, mains pipes meters and apparatus, and other property, whether real or personal, and works connected therewith, and whether within or without the borough, held, possessed, enjoyed, or acquired by, or attaching to, or vested in, or belonging to the Local Board, under or by virtue of the Orders and Acts specified in the Schedule hereto, or any of them, shall pass or be transferred to, be exerciseable or enforceable by, or against, vest in or attach to, and be held and enjoyed by or against the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay as the Sanitary Authority, and every reference in the said Acts or Orders to the Local Board shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses and the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses shall be substituted in the said Acts and Orders, and any contract thereto scheduled, for the Local Board for all purposes, and every reference to or incorporation by the said Acts of any provisions of the Public Health Act 1875, or the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of a Local Board, shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to or an incorporation of the corresponding provisions of the Public Health Act 1875, and the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of an Urban Sanitary Authority of a municipal borough, Every contract and contractual engagement entered into by or with the Local Board under or by virtue of the said Acts or Orders, or any of them, shall be deemed to have been entered into by or with the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay as the Sanitary

Authority.

"11. The district fund and general district rate of the Borough of Torquay shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and general district rate respectively of the Local Board, and all sums of money respectively payable

to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said district fund or general district rate shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon the said district fund and general district rate leviable in the said Borough

"12. All powers, authorities, duties, obligations, liabilities, privileges, rights, interests, mains, pipes, drains and apparatus and other property, whether real or personal, and works connected therewith, and whether within or without the Borough, held, possessed, enjoyed, or acquired by, or attaching to, or vested in, or belonging to the Torquay Local Board under or by virtue of the said Provisional Order of 1882, made by the Local Government Board, and of the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1882, and of the said special agreements as to sewage with the Local Authorities of the parishes of St. Marychurch and Cockington, and the special agreements for supply of water to the Local Authorities of various parishes and consumers all in the County of Devon, but without the Local Government District aforesaid, or any of them, shall pass, or be transferred to, be exerciseable or enforceable by or against, vest in, or attach to, and be held and enjoyed by, or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay as the Sanitary Authority, and every reference in the said Order, Act, or special agreements to the Torquay Local Board, shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses and the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses shall be substituted in the said Order, Act and special agreements for the said Board for all purposes, and every reference to or incorporation by the said Order or Act of any provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, or the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of a Local Board, shall be deemed and construed to be a reference or incorporation to or of the corresponding provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of an Urban Sanitary Authority of a Municipal Borough. The officers and servants of the Local Board shall become the officers and servants of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay. Every contract and contractual engagement entered into by or with the Local Board under or by virtue of the said Order, Act, and special agreements, or any of them, shall be deemed to have been entered into by or with the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay as the Sanitary Autho-

"13. All the powers, authorities, duties, obligations, liabilities, privileges, rights and interests held, possessed, enjoyed, or acquired by, or attaching to, or vested in, or belonging to the Torquay Local Board under, or by virtue of, the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1891, or under, or by virtue of the Provisional Order of the Local Government Board of the 26th April, 1892, shall pass, or be transferred to, be exerciseable, or enforceable, by or against the Mayor Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay, and every reference in the said Act and Order shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses and the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses shall, for all purposes be substituted in the said Act and Order for the said Local Board.

"14. All bye-laws rules and regulations made by the Local Board under or in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1875, or any Acts amending or extending the same, or any Act thereby repealed and under or in pursuance of the Local Acts, or the said Provisional Orders or Acts confirming the said Provisional Orders hereinbefore recited and all regulations made by the said Local Board under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1888, and all other regulations which are severally in force immediately before the commencement of this scheme shall continue in force and be enforceable within the same area to which the said bye-laws and regulations then apply as if they had been made by the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses under the said Acts and Orders, the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses and their officers being substituted for the said Local Board and their officers.

"15. All lists of fees, tolls, rates, and charges made by the Local Board and in force at the commencement of this scheme, shall continue in force until the same are repealed or varied by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses.

4. 16. The transfers from the Local Board to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of any powers rights duties capacities, liabilities obligagations, or property ordered, directed or declared, or intended to be effected by this Scheme shall be effectual and operative, whether or not such transfers may also have been effected or carried out by or under section 310 of the

Public Health Act, 1875.

"17. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough of Torquay and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the Local Board, shall be as good valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against, and with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses as if the same had been made, entered into, or done by to or with reference to the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses instead of to the Local Board, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses instead of the said Local Board had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

" Compensation for Existing Officers.

"18. In case any officer of the Local Board who shall have been employed by the Local Board shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, such officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two or more of them, to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of 'The Superannuation Act 1859,' to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for

granting such allowance shall be necessary or Provided nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term 'Officer' shall include only persons employed by the Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them, shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them, shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause. And further, every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right title claim amount or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause, as the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable and no other rights. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

" Audit of Accounts.

"19. The accounts of the Local Board and its officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the district auditor, in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted. The provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board, with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards and of their officers, shall apply to such audit, and the provisions of this scheme with respect to the Local Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any sums certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the borough.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Local Board for the District of Southend and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 :-

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Act named and containing such provisions as are in the said

Act particularized.

"And whereas certain Inhabitant Householders of the Town and District of Southend, in the County of Essex, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of

Incorporation.

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter has been referred to the Committee of Council and it is proposed to create the said Town and District within the limits set forth in the Charter in that behalf a Municipal Borough and to incorpora:e the Inhabitants thereof, and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

"And whereas in the year 1866 the Local Government Act. 1858, was adopted in a part of

the present District of Southend.

"And whereas by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board for the then District of Southend became an Urban Sanitary Authority, and the District for which they acted became an Urban Sanitary District.

"And whereas in the year 1877, the said Urban Sanitary District was by a provisional order of the Local Government Board extended, and the limits thereof thereby became and are now coextensive with the limits of the Municipal

Borough created by the said Charter.

"And whereas by the Southend Local Board Act 1875 the Local Board were empowered to purchase the pier and undertaking of the Southend Pier Company, and the property belonging thereto or held therewith, and were further for the purposes of the said Act (and independently of any other borrowing powers of the said Local Board), empowered to borrow upon the security of the District Fund Account and General District Rates of the district so much money as they deemed necessary for the purposes of the said

" And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act of 1875 the Local Board purchased the said pier and undertaking of the said Southend Pier Company, and all the rights and powers of the said Pier Company in that behalf are vested in held and exerciscable by the

Local Board.

"And whereas by the Southend Local Board - Act 1887, the Local Board obtained power to acquire certain portions of the foreshore of the county of Essex, and to make new piers and to carry out other works, and were for such purposes empowered to borrow, (independently of any other borrowing powers of the said Local Board,) upon the security of the District Fund and General District Rates, certain sums of £87,600 and £26,000, and such further sums as might be, from time to time sanctimed by the Local Government Board, and were also empowered to borrow money by means of a loan or loans to be raised by the issue of debentures, debenture stock, and annuity certificates or any of them.

"And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said last-mentioned Acts various sums of money amounting in the whole to £106,320 have been borrowed by the Local Board upon the security aforesaid whereof the sum of £99,626 Os. 3d. now remains to be repaid and

outstanding.

"And whereas by a Provisional Order granted. by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and duly confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1891, the said Local Board were authorized to supply Electricity for public and private purposes within the whole of the said Urban Sanitary District of Southend.

And whereas under and by victue of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and the various Acts amending the same, a School Board was formed for the School District of the parish of Prittlewell, hereinafter called the Prittlewell

School Board.

"And whereas the district of the said Prittlewell School Board is coterminous with the proposed Municipal Borough, and it is desirable that the said Prittlewell School Board should become the School Board for the said Borough in the manner hereinafter provided.

"And whereas the said Local Board and the said School Board are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 and of the Municipal Corporations

Act 1885.

And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Board of Trade, to the Local Government Board and to the Education Department.

"And whereas it is expedient that a scheme should be made and settled containing the pro-

visions hereinafter set forth.

"Now therefore, in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions hereinafter set forth and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows :-

"(1.) This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the 'Borough of Southend-on-Sea

Scheme, 1892.

"(2) This Scheme shall come and be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to, or at the date of the confirmation of this scheme by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later, and this date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this Scheme.' So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

"(3.) The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this scheme and thenceforward be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea, acting by the Council of the Municipal Borough as the sanitary authority of the said

Borough.

"(+.) The Southend Local Board and their powers, duties, obligations, liabilities, and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this

Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough, and the said Local Board shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to and exercise the said powers, duties, rights, obligations. liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be and be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted.

"(5.) Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Southend Local Board shall be abolished and shall thence orth be

dissolved and cease to exist.

"(6.) All the jurisdiction powers duties and property possessed by or vested in the Southend Local Board, or any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Southend Local Board, or any of their members as such (and not dealt with or transferred by or under any other part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said

"(7.) All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Southend Local Board or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea.

"(8.) Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to, or incurred by or on behalf of the Southend Local Board, before the commencement of this Scheme, may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of

Southend-on-Sea.

"(9.) The term 'property' in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to tolls, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in, or in respect of any property so defined.

" (10.) The district fund and the general district rate of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and general district rate respectively of the Local Board, and all sums of money respectively payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said district fund or general district rate shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon the said district fund and general district rate leviable

in the said borough respectively.

"(11.) All the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property whatsoever of the Southend Local Board acting as the Urban Sanitary authority for the District of Southend, and under or by virtue of the following Acts namely, the Public Health Act, 1875, and an Act amending or extending the same, the Sanitary Acts as defined by the Public Health Act 1875, and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar to those of the aforesaid Acts, shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exerciseable by and shall be enforceable against the

Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea acting by the Council as the Sanitary authority for the said Borough.

"(12.) All bye-laws and regulations made by the Local Board under or in pursuance of the Public Health Act 1875 and any Act amending or extending the same or any Act thereby repealed, and all regulations made by the Local Board under the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, which are in force at the commencement of this scheme shall continue in force and be enforceable throughout the Borough, and may be altered amended and revoked as if the said bye-laws and regulations had been made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council as the Sanitary authority under the said Acts and Order, the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses and their officers being substituted for the said Local Board and their officers.

(13.) With respect to the School Board the

following provisions shall have effect:

(1) The Prittlewell School Board shall become School Board for the Borough of Southend-on-Sea by the name of 'the School Board of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea, in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Prittlewell School Board the Borough of Southend-on-Sea had been a Municipal Borough, and the said Prittlewell School Board had been created for the said Borough, and as if the local rate and the rating authority had been the borough fund or rate and the Council of the said Borough respectively, and everything in connection with the said School Board shall be had done and construed accordingly.

"(2) All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the Prittlewell School Board immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the School Board for the Borough of Southend-on-Sea, and all charges charged on the School fund and Poor Rate of the Parish of Prittlewell immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged upon the School Fund of the Southend-on-Sea School Board and upon the Borough Rate or Fund of the said

Borough and not otherwise.

"(3) Any bye-laws made by the Prittlewell School Board under the Acts relating to public clementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Southend-on-Sea

Borough School District.

"(4) Any act or omission done or made by the Education Department or the said Prittlewell School Board or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made, if the said Department, School Board or Justice might have lawfully done or made the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said Borough.

(14.) With respect to the powers rights and duties of the Local Board under and by virtue of the Southend Local Board Acts 1875 and 1887,

the following provisions shall have effect:—
"(1.) The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea shall be substituted for the Local Board and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exerciseable by the said Local Board in pursuance of the said Acts shall be transferred to vest in be exerciseable by attach to and be enforceable by or against the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses.

"(2.) All bye-laws rules and regulations lists of fees rates tolls and charges made by the Local Board shall continue in force until the same are repealed or varied by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses under the provisions of the said Acts.

"(15.) The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sca shall, in respect of the laws relating to the supply of electricity be substituted for the Local Board, and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties, and liabilities vested in devolving upon, or exerciseable by the said Local Board in pursuance of the Electric Lighting Acts, and under any Provisional Orders confirmed by Parliament relating thereto as the same now exist shall be transferred to, vest in, be exerciseable by, attach to, and be enforceable by or against the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses.

"All bye-laws regulations and lists of fees and charges made by the Local Board by virtue of the said Acts and Orders shall continue in force until the same shall be repealed or varied by the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses.

"(16.) The accounts of the Southend Local Board and of their Officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted. The provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards and of their Officers shall apply to such audit, and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the said Local Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any sums certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

"(17.) In case any Officer of the Southend Local Board who sha'l have been employed by the said Local Board in respect of any of the matters dealt with by this Scheme for a period of at least five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him such Officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough such annual allowance or gratuity as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Comniissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his Office; provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made; and provided, never- 1870-

theless that if any such Officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years after the commencement of this Scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council; provided also that the term 'Officer' shall include all salaried persons employed by the Southend Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons. The said Lords Commissioners or any two of them shall be the sole and final judges of any question whatever which may arise under this clause, whether as to the amount, character of or right to any compensation or otherwise howsoever, and no Officer shall have any right or claim except such as the said Lords Commissioners may determine. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or of any two of them shall be final and conclusive, and may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any

"(18.) Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this scheme by, to, or with reference to the Local Board, shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, entered into, done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the Local Board, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the Local Board had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

"(19.) Nothing contained in this scheme shall prejudice or affect the rights, interests, powers, authorities, or privileges, transferred to the management of the Board of Trade by the Crown Lands Act, 1866, nor shall anything in this scheme contained extend to take away, prejudice, diminish, or alter any of the estates, rights, privileges, powers, or authorities vested in, or enjoyed or exerciseable by the Queen's Majesty, Her Heirs, or Successors."

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Discharge of Casual Paupers:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions in England and Wales for the time being:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations with reference to Casual Paupers;

And whereas Arcicle 9 of the said General Order, after reciting Section 4 of the Casual Poor Act, 1882, directs as follows, viz., "A "Casual Pauper shall not be allowed to discharge himself at an earlier period than that at which "he is entitled to discharge himself under the "Section above cited:

"Provided as follows:

"(I.) The Guardians may give any directions
"to the Master of the Workhouse, or to the
"Superintendent of the Casual Ward, with
"respect to the discharge of any class or
"classes of Casual Paupers before the expira"tion of the respective periods specified in
"the Section above-cited, and such directions
"shall be followed by the Master or Super"intendent.

"(2.) If in the opinion of the Master of the "Workhouse, or the Superintendent of the "Casual Ward, any special circumstances "shall require that a Casual Pauper shall be "discharged before the expiration of either of the periods mentioned in the Section above-cited, he may discharge such pauper accordingly, and shall report the facts of the case to the Guardians at their next meeting."

And whereas it is expedient that the said General Order should be amended as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—The above-cited Article 9 of the said. General Order of the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso; that is to say,—

(3.) A Casual Pauper, who has been detained for more than one night, and who represents to the Master of the Workhouse or the Superintendent of the Casual Ward that he is desirous of seeking work, shall, if he has to the best of his ability performed the prescribed Task of Work, be allowed to discharge himself at the time hereinafter mentioned on the day upon which he is discharged; that is to say.

During the period between Lady Day and Michaelmas Day, half-past five o'clock in the morning.

During the period between Michaelmas Day and Lady Day, half-past six o'clock in the morning. The request of such Casual Pauper shall not be refused except on the ground that he has not performed the prescribed Task of Work to the best of his ability, and every such refusal shall be reported to the Guardians at their next ordinary meeting by the Master of the Workhouse or the Superintendent of the Casual Ward, as the case may be.

ARTICLE II.—Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to prevent the Guardians, or the Master of the Workhouse, or the Superintendent of the Casual Ward, from exercising the powers conferred upon them, respectively, by paragraphs (1) and (2) of the proviso to the above cited Article of the said General Order with respect to the discharge of Casual Paupers.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall take effect from the seventh day after the date hereof.
