No. 226.—NORTH AMERICA AND WEST INDIES STATION.

UNITED STATES—NEW YORK.—LONG ISLAND SOUND.

(1.) *Oyster Bay—Alterations in the Character of Cold Spring Harbour Light.*

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 31st May, 1892, the following alteration will be made in the character of Cold Spring Harbour (Centre Hog Island) Light, Oyster Bay, Long Island Sound:—

Cold Spring Harbour Light will be a fixed white light, showing a sector of fixed red light from the bearing of S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. (indicating Centre Island Reef or Middle Ground Buoy, black, No. 17), through East, to N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

Approximate position, lat. $40^{\circ} 54\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $73^{\circ} 29\frac{1}{2}'$ W.

(2.) *Execution Rocks Light—Alteration in Character.*

Also, that on or about 31st May, 1892, the following alteration will be made in the character of Execution Rocks Light, Long Island Sound:—

Execution Rocks Light will be a flashing white light every thirty seconds, showing a sector of flashing red light through an arc of 37° , or from the bearing of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. to E. by N. (the present sector of fixed red light).

Approximate position, lat. $40^{\circ} 52\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $73^{\circ} 44'$ W.

[Variation 8° Westerly in 1892.]
