

would bear, and to enter with Fire and Sword into the Country of *Rhinow*, have not yet attempted to execute their design, and in the mean-time the Confederate Forces that were quartered about *Mentz*, are marching that way, to be ready to receive them if there be occasion. The Enemy having some days ago had notice that the Count de *Palff* was abroad with a Convoy of but 30 Horse, they immediately sent out a Party of 200 to intercept him, but he having instead of 30 taken with him 117 Hossars, and being informed in his march that the Enemy had laid an Ambush for him, he marched towards them, and attacking them, killed 63 upon the place, and took 35 Prisoners. The Letters from *Basse* of the 10th Instant say, that the Protestant Cantons had received the Bishop and Bishoprick of *Basse* as well Papists as Protestants into their Protection; and that the Popish Cantons had in return likewise taken under their Protection the City and Territory of *Geneva*, together with the Country of *Vaux*. These Letters also tell us, that the *Sieur d'Herwart*, was arrived at *Geneva* with the Character of the King of *England's* Minister, and that thereupon the French Resident left that City the next day.

*Cologne, Jan. 23.* The Count de *Coringlack* is daily expected here with Orders from our Elector about the repairing or demolishing the Fortifications of *Beni*. The Letters of yesterday from *Clèves* say, that the Elector of *Brandenburg* was upon his departure from thence for the *Hague*.

*Brussels, Jan. 30.* We are expecting with great impatience the news of the King of *England's* arrival in *Holland*. The Elector of *Bavaria* intends to meet His Majesty at the *Hague*; and the Count de *Windisgratz* is to repair thither, to Compliment His Majesty, and to assist at the Conferences, on the part of the Emperor. During the late Incurtion of the *Marquis de Boufflers* into *Flanders*, the Viscount de *Maude*, Governor of *Aeth*, drew out part of the Regiment of *Chimay*, and that of *Nassau* of *Hérle*, the Dragoons of *Alsace*, the Italian Regiment of *Teraceffe*, and the German Regiments of *Horne* and *Anhalt* in order to enter into the Enemies Territories; This Detachment went from *Aeth* on the 14th under the command of the *Sieur de la Cattoise*, and marched through *Blisqui*, *Briffels*, and the Plain of *Mortagne*, and passed the *Schelle*; The Dragoons and Italian Foot attack'd the first Fort built by the Enemy on the side of the River, which after about half an hours resistance they made themselves Masters of, the Garrison remaining Prisoners of War; At the same time another Detachment attack'd the 2d Fort, which they took with less opposition than the other. Our Troops demolished these two Forts, and burnt from *Ankoin* as far as *Mortagne*, and having left a Guard to secure the passage of the River, dispersed themselves into the Country, and plundered divers Villages, and took several Hostages for the payment of Contributions; after which they returned in good Order to *Aeth*. A Body of Dutch Troops with several Regiments of *Brandenburg* and *Esage*, are advanced towards *St. Iyon* and *Tirlemont*, to be there in a readines to march either towards the *Schelde*, or the *Sambre*, as it may be necessary, to observe the Enemy, who by their Preparations at *Tournay*, and their other Garrison, seem to have some new design in hand.

*Falmouth, Jan. 19.* Yesterday arrived here the Pacquet-Boat, called, *The Spanish Expedition*, from the *Greyne*. They came out on the 10th of this Month, and the next day took a French Vessel of about 50 Tuns laden with Sugars and Oranges from *Portugal*, which they sent back to the *Greyne*. The *Brandenburg* Ships, mentioned in our last, did not put to Sea till yesterday morning.

*Plimouth, Jan. 20.* Since my last is arrived in this Port *The Society of London*, *George Giles* Master, from *Legborne*.

*Whitehall, Jan. 25.* By Letters from Rear-Admiral *Rocke* dated yesterday in the afternoon on Board the *Charles Gaiety* in *Margate* Road, we have an account, That His Majesty landed in *Holland* a little to the Northward of the *Musele*, on Tuesday last in the afternoon; when the Men of War anchored off of *Goree*, and continued there till

Wednesday morning to see the Yachts and small Frigats harboured.
