The Enemy having some days ago had notice that the Count de Palft was abroad with a Convoy of but 30 Horse, they immediately sent out a Party of 200 to intercept him, but he having instead of 30 taken with him 117 Hussay, and being informed in his march that the Enemy had laid an Ambush for him, he marched towards them, and attacking them, killed 63 upon the place, and took 35 Prisoners. The Letters from Bussey is the 10th Instant say, that the Protestant Cantons had received the Bishop and Bishoprick of Basse well Papists as Protestants into their Protection; and that the Popish Cantons had in return likewise taken under their Protection the City and Territory of Geneva, together with the Country of Vaux. These Letters also tell us, that the Sieur d'Herwart was arrived at Geneva with the Character of the King of England's Minister, and that thereupon the French Resident left that City the next day.
