THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegrams from the British Legation at St. Petersburg:—

“25th June, 1892.—It is rumoured that there have been cases of cholera at Astrakhan, and although there has been no official announcement, the press admits that cholera has broken out at Samarcand, Usun Ada, the Caspian terminus of the Transcaspian Railway, and Baku.”

“27th June, 1892.—It is rumoured that cholera has appeared at Tiflis and Batoum, and it is officially announced to be at Baku.”

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 28th June, 1892, from Her

Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, stating that ten days' quarantine is imposed on arrivals from the Russian coast, from Sokum Kale to Batoum, inclusive, and medical visit is applied to arrivals from all Russian, Roumanian, and Bulgarian ports.
