In the High Court of Justice.—Companies
(Winding-up).

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1890, and in the Matter of the New Oriental Bank Corporation Limited.

BY an Order made by Mr. Justice Vaughan Williams in the above matter, dated the 5th day of July, 1892, on the petitions of the abovenamed Company and David Crammond Campbell, it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the Company should be continued,

but subject to the supervision of the Court; and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up may be adopted as the Court shall think fit; and the creditors, contributories, and Liquidator of the Company, and all other persons interested, are to be at liberty to apply to the Court as there may be occasion.—Dated this 14th day of July, 1892.
