## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1878-1891.

Order of Secretary of State requiring Occupiers of certain Factories and Workshops to keep Lists of Outworkers.

WHEREAS by section 27 (1) of the Factory

and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that:—
"The occupier of every factory and workshop "(including any workshop conducted on the system of not employing any child, young " person, or woman therein) and every contractor " employed by any such occupier in the business " of the factory or workshop shall, if so required " by the Secretary of State, by an Order made in " accordance with section sixty-five of the principal "Act, and subject to any exceptions mentioned " in the Order, keep in the prescribed form and " with the prescribed particulars lists showing the " names of all persons directly employed by him, " either as workman or as contractor, in the busi-"ness of the factory or workshop, outside the " factory or workshop, and the places where they " are employed, and every such list shall be open to "inspection by any inspector under the principal "Act, or by any officer of a sanitary authority."

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under section 65 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, and section 27 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, require the occupier of every factory and workshop (including any workshop conducted on the system of not employing any child, young person, or woman therein), and every contractor employed by any such occupier in the business mentioned in the schedule hereunder, to keep in the prescribed form and with the prescribed particulars, lists showing the names of all persons directly employed by him, either as workman or as contractor, in the said business outside the factory or workshop and the places where they are employed; and every such list shall be open to inspection by any Inspector under the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, or by any officer of a sanitary authority.

This Order shall come into effect on the 15th day of August, 1892, and shall continue in force until revoked. Henry Matthews.
