PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington and out of the following new parishes namely the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John Vartry-road Stamford Hill, and the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, all in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington, of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington, of the said new parish of Saint John Vartry-road Stamford Hill and of the said new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes

of Divine worship.

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty sixth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of December following the rectory of Saint Margaret Lothbury with Saint Christopher le Stocks and Saint Bartholomew by the Exchange and the united rectory of Saint Olave Old Jewry with Saint Martin Pomeroy Saint Mildred Poultry and Saint Mary Colechurch,

within the city and diocese of London were united into one benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that an ecclesiastical district to be formed within the limits of the Metropolis should be selected by the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain and by the Bishop of London as the district for which a church should be built (and consecrated by the name of Saint Olave) out of the proceeds of the sale or sales which have since been duly carried into effect, of the materials and site of the church of Saint Olave Old Jewry directed by that Order to be taken down.

"And whereas the district hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the said Lord Chancellor and by the said Bishop of London as the district for which a church shall be built and consecrated as provided by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council.

"And whereas out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinbefore mentioned we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners are authorized by the said Order in Council to set apart a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand pounds for or towards the acquisition of suitable sites for and the erection of a new church and parsonage house within the limits of the said proposed district as the church and parsonage for such district.

"And whereas under the terms of the said Order in Council it is further provided that out of the income of the united rectory of Saint Margaret Lothbury with Saint Christopher le Stocks Saint Bartholomew by the Exchange Saint Olave Old Jewry Saint Martin Pomeroy Saint Mildred Poultry and Saint Mary Colechurch there shall be paid by the rector thereof a clear annual sum of five hundred and forty pounds to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the new district hereinafter proposed to be constituted as the endowment thereof. And whereas the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall become a new parish then of the same new parish will under the provisions of the said Order in Council be vested in Your Majesty and be exercised by the Lord Chancellor on behalf of the

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish
