#### (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED ZONE.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following district or area which is declared by Order of the Board dated the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zone (namely),—a district or area comprising Midlothian (county of Edinburgh), and also comprising the burghs of Edinburgh, Leith, Musselburgh, and Portobello,—are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the district or area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the district or area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zone, and shall be subject to those provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1892, No. 2, dated the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, which relate to Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zones and of any Order amending the same.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

### SCHEDULE.

#### *Description of Infected Zone.*

A district or area comprising the burghs of Edinburgh, Leith, Musselburgh, and Portobello, and also comprising Midlothian (county of Edinburgh) except that portion thereof known as the Gala Water District in the south-eastern corner of the county consisting of the parishes of Stow, Temple, Crichton, Heriot, Borthwick, Fala and Soutra, and Cranston; and also except that portion of the Calder District of the county consisting of the parishes of Mid Calder, West Calder, and Kirknewton.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, defining a part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals wharf: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

#### (PORT OF LIVERPOOL—DEFINITION OF WALLASEY FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Wallasey Dock partly in the borough of Birkenhead and partly in the township of Poulton-cum-Seacombe, in the county of Chester, situate on the east and north sides of the said dock, bounded by a line commencing on the Wallasey landing-stage at a point seventy-eight feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said stage, thence running in a westwardly direction thirty-six feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular-direction northwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly two hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence running in a straight line northwardly six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence north-westwardly seventy-five feet or thereabouts,
