Rome, January 13.

He Advices we have from Naples, of the breaking out of a Contageous Diftemper in some Parts of that Kingdom, (tho' the City of Naples is wholly free of it) has occasioned fereral Meetings here of divers Cardinals and others, for the taking the necessary Precintions to prevent is spreading into the Ecclesiastical Territories; and Commissioners have been sent to our Sea-Ports, and to the places bordering on that Kingdom, to put in execution the Orders that are given for that purpose. Our differences with the Imperial Court, occasioned, among other things, by the late Promotion of Cardinals, do still continue, with little appearance of an Adjustment: The Baron Cafinet is arrived here from Vienna, and has had a long Conference on this inbied with the Prince de Lichtenstein the Empe-m's Minister here, and the Cardinals in his Interests, but the Refult thereof is not yet known. The French Ambaffador cannot with all his Endeavours, and the Affiffance of the Cardinal de Fourbin, who is look'd opon to be in great Credit with the Pope, obtain the Bulls which he has to long and earnestly follicitedfor the French Bishops, and is at last going away without any fatisfaction in this Matter. The Letten come in this day from Ancona, give an account of another Earthquake which has happened there, and done much damage.
Turin, January 13. Prince Eugene of Savry went

from hence some days ago to command the German Imops, who have, by the Emperor's Orders, taken their Winter Quarters in Montferrat; and it's belived, that they will to post themselves, as to block

up the French Garison in Caza'.

Milan, January 17. The Emperor having affind the German Troops, in the Service of the Dake of Savoy, the Dutchy of Montferrat for their Winter Quarters, the People of that Country at hist pretended to oppose them, and applied themkiva to the Governor of Cazal for affiftance, who detached 500 men of that Garifon to joyn with 600 of the Militia of the Country; These marched to Grander, and attacked the Germans quartered there, the defended the place till 6 other Companies, that were lodged hard by, came to their Relief, and then filing together upon the French, they quite routed them, killing a great number upon the place, and taking the rest Prisoners, except only 12 Dragoons who escaped to Cazal. Vienna, January 21. The Letters of the 3d instant from Cronstade give this account of the late Astron, in which Prince Angustus of Hanouer was killed. Upon advice that Teckeley designed another Irruption into Transilvania, he marched with 1900 Horse to possess, himself of the Pass of Chermerz, where Teckeley had laid an Ambush of 1500 Foot; The Prince having no information of this, or being betrayed by his Guides, rid on at the Head of his Troops to the fraitest part of the Pass, (where but one man at a time can go through, and where consequently he had very few near him) and had his Horse shot under him by the Enemy, who rushing on presently, cut him and some others in pieces with their Sabres. In the mean time General Vecerani, with the Baron Pace, marched after the Prince night and day with 7 Regiments, but Teckeley having notice of their approach, retired again into Va'a-chia; General Veterani being come to the Pais, found there the Body of the Prince, and fent out Parties, who purfued the Enemy several miles. We have an account likewise, of two other Actions in Upper Hungary, one near Great Waradin, from whence 800 Turkish House marched towards Debrezen to feek Booty, advice of which being brought to Calo, the Count de Zrin (Lieutenau:-Colonel to the Regiment of Caprara) with a good Party of Men lay in wait to surprize them at their return, which they did with that success, that they killed a great many, took 68 Prisoners, and put the rest to flight. The other Rencounter was near Lippa, in which Colonel Pollard killed above 100 Turks. The Emperor has recalled his Ambassador from Rome; and at the sime time it has, by his Imperial Maicsties Order. been fignified to the Pope's Inter-Nuncio reliding here, That he forbear coming to Court.

Prenefort, February 1. The Count de Winditsgratz, who is going to the Haque on the part of the Emperor, arrived here this day, and will part again to morrow to continue his Journey thither. Three days ago a Party of 200 French passed the Rhing at Manham, having ade ign upon a place called Weinheim; but they found the Gardon too strong for them, and thereupon refired and repassed the Rhing, after having burnt 4 or 3 Hoffs near Bib spherin.
