Rome, January 13.

**T**He Advices we have from *Naples*, of the breaking out of a Contagious Distemper in some Parts of that Kingdom, (tho' the City of *Naples* is wholly free of it) has occasioned several Meetings here of divers Cardinals and others, for the taking the necessary Precautions to prevent its spreading into the Ecclesiastical Territories; and Commissioners have been sent to our Sea-Ports, and to the places bordering on that Kingdom, to put in execution the Orders that are given for that purpose. Our differences with the Imperial Court, occasioned, among other things, by the late Promotion of Cardinals, do still continue, with little appearance of an Adjustment: The Baron *Casinet* is arrived here from *Vienna*, and has had a long Conference on this subject with the Prince de *Lichtenstein* the Emperor's Minister here, and the Cardinals in his Interests, but the Result thereof is not yet known. The French Ambassador cannot with all his Endeavours, and the Assistance of the Cardinal de *Foumbin*, who is look'd upon to be in great Credit with the Pope, obtain the Bulls which he has so long and earnestly solicited for the French Bishops, and is at last going away without any satisfaction in this Matter. The Letters come in this day from *Ancona*, give an account of another Earthquake which has happened there, and done much damage.

*Turin*, January 13. Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy* went from hence some days ago to command the German Troops, who have, by the Emperor's Orders, taken their Winter Quarters in *Monferrat*; and it's believed, that they will so posit themselves, as to block up the French Garrison in *Cazal*.

*Milan*, January 17. The Emperor having assigned the German Troops, in the Service of the Duke of *Savoy*, the Dutchy of *Monferrat* for their Winter Quarters, the People of that Country at first pretended to oppose them, and applied themselves to the Governor of *Cazal* for assistance, who detached 500 men of that Garrison to joyn with 600 of the Militia of the Country; These marched to *Granar*, and attacked the Germans quartered there, who defended the place till 6 other Companies, that were lodged hard by, came to their Relief, and then falling together upon the French, they quite routed them, killing a great number upon the place, and taking the rest Prisoners, except only 12 Dragoons who escaped to *Cazal*. Since this, the *Montferrins* have sent Deputies to Prince *Eugene* to Compliment him, and to assure him of their submission to the Emperor's Orders about the Quarters for the Troops under his command: And the Germans are approached nearer to *Cazal*, in order to block up that Garrison.

*Venez*, January 20. The French Men of War and Privateers having of late taken divers Venetian

Ships, and carried them to their Ports in *Provence*, the Senate have made Complaint thereof to the French Ambassador, with a demand of speedy Reparation. Divers Persons of Quality are come hither to partake of the Divertisements of the *Carnival*, which began last Tuesday.

*Vienna*, January 21. The Letters of the 3d instant from *Cronstadt* give this account of the late Action, in which Prince *Augustus* of *Hanover* was killed. Upon advice that *Teckley* designed another Irruption into *Transilvania*, he marched with 1000 Horse to possess himself of the Pass of *Chermerz*, where *Teckley* had laid an Ambush of 1500 Foot; The Prince having no information of this, or being betrayed by his Guides, rid on at the Head of his Troops to the straitest part of the Pass, (where but one man at a time can go through, and where consequently he had very few near him) and had his Horse shot under him by the Enemy, who rushing on presently, cut him and some others in pieces with their Sabres. In the mean time General *Veterani*, with the Baron *Pace*, marched after the Prince night and day with 7 Regiments, but *Teckley* having notice of their approach, retired again into *Valachia*; General *Veterani* being come to the Pass, found there the Body of the Prince, and sent out Parties, who pursued the Enemy several miles. We have an account likewise, of two other Actions in *Upper Hungary*, one near *Great Waradin*, from whence 800 Turkish Horse marched towards *Debregen* to seek Booty, advice of which being brought to *Calo*, the Count de *Zrin* (Lieutenant-Colonel to the Regiment of *Caprara*) with a good Party of Men lay in wait to surprize them at their return, which they did with that success, that they killed a great many, took 68 Prisoners, and put the rest to flight. The other Rencontre was near *Lippa*, in which Colonel *Pollard* killed above 100 Turks. The Emperor has recalled his Ambassador from *Rome*; and at the same time it has, by his Imperial Majesties Order, been signified to the Pope's Inter-Nuncio residing here, That he forbear coming to Court.

*Frankfort*, February 1. The Count de *Winditsgratz*, who is going to the *Hague* on the part of the Emperor, arrived here this day, and will part again to morrow to continue his Journey thither. Three days ago a Party of 400 French passed the *Rhine* at *Mimbam*, having a design upon a place called *Winkelheim*; but they found the Garrison too strong for them, and thereupon retired and repassed the *Rhine*, after having burnt 4 or 5 Houses near *Biblsheim*.

*Paris*, January 29. The Count de *Efrees* is gone Post from hence for *Toulon*; 'Tis still said, that the Ships which are fitting out there are designed against *Algiers*. The Regiment of Guards have Orders to be in a readiness to begin their march the 15th of the next Month towards *Flanders*. We hear from *Savoy*, that 500 French having marched from *Cazal*, to attack some of the German Troops quartered in *Monferrat*, they were opposed by the Regiment of *Tiff*, and took of them several.

*Brussels*, January 27. The Marquis de *Beaufort*, our Maître de Camp General, is gone to visit the Count de *Moy*, *Charleroy*, and *Namur*, and to tell of some Con-
