

it was further provided by the said Act that in the case of any Coroner's district being situate partly within and partly without the said county of London, the County Councils of the counties in which such district was situate should arrange for the alteration in manner provided by law of the district, so that on the next avoidance of the office of Coroner, or at any earlier date fixed when the alteration should be made, the Coroners' districts should not be situate in more than one county.

And whereas all the said Coroners' districts of the county of Middlesex are now situate in part within the said county of London, and in part within the said county of Middlesex with the exception of the south-eastern district which is now wholly within the county of London.

And whereas the Kingston and Croydon Coroners' Districts in the county of Surrey are now situate in part within the said county of London and in part within the said county of Surrey while the Newington and Camberwell Coroners' districts of the said county are now wholly situate within the county of London and the Guildford district is now wholly within the county of Surrey.

And whereas the Greenwich Coroner's District of the county of Kent is now situate in part within the said county of London and in part within the said county of Kent and the other Coroners' Districts of the county of Kent are now wholly within the said county of Kent.

And whereas the County Councils of London, Middlesex, Surrey and Kent, have presented petitions to Her Majesty praying that the Coroners' districts of each of the said counties may be altered in order that such districts may henceforth be wholly situate within one county.

And whereas the London County Council has further petitioned Her Majesty that the county of London may be divided into eight Coroners' districts in such manner and with such boundaries as hereinafter described.

And whereas such petitions with a description

of the proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the petitions were founded were duly certified to Her Majesty.

And whereas all the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act in that behalf have been complied with in relation to the said petitions.

And whereas George Perceval Wyatt one of Her Majesty's Coroners for the counties of London and Surrey has petitioned Her Majesty that so much of the parish of Lambeth as lies south and south-east of the centre of the Clapham Kennington and Westminster Bridge roads may form part of the proposed Southern Coroner's District of the county of London.

And whereas no other Coroner of the counties aforesaid has presented a petition to Her Majesty.

And whereas Her Majesty has, with the advice of Her Privy Council, taken into consideration the petitions of the aforesaid County Councils, and the petition of the said George Perceval Wyatt, and is minded to make such alteration and division as is herein provided.

Now therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, direct and declare, and it is hereby ordered, directed and declared that from the date hereof,

(1.) The county of London shall be divided into eight districts for Coroners' purposes, and for the purposes of the said first recited Act.

(2.) The said eight districts shall be named respectively the Eastern Coroner's District, the North-eastern Coroner's District, the Central Coroner's District, the Western Coroner's District, the Penge Coroner's District, the Southern Coroner's District, the South-western Coroner's District, and the South-eastern Coroner's District, and the said districts shall respectively comprise the several parishes and places, and have the boundaries prescribed and mentioned in that behalf in the schedule hereto.

(3.) This Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

The districts herein described are to be deemed not to include any parishes, or places, or parts thereof, which were, prior to the first April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, exempt from the jurisdiction of the Coroners of the counties of Middlesex Surrey and Kent respectively, whether such parishes, places, or parts thereof, are hereinafter named, or included, or not.
