THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople:—

Pera, September 8, 1892.

Board of Health here decided yesterday that arrivals from London, Liverpool, Shields, Grimsby, Glasgow, and Swansea will perform five days' quarantine at Dardanelles before being allowed to come to Constantinople. This regulation does not affect ships in transit to Russian ports. Arrivals from every part of the coast extending from Cronstadt to Cherbourg will perform ten days' quarantine at Clazomenes or Beyrouth; arrivals from Mediterranean ports of France, Italy, and Austria with passengers will perform five days' quarantine at any Turkish port where there is a sanitary doctor. Arrivals from Kurra-chee and from every Persian port in the Persian Gulf will perform ten days' quarantine at Bussorah. Arrivals from every port in the Pashalic of Yemen will have to undergo ten days' quarantine as well as arrivals from every part of the coast line extending from Guardafui to Massowah.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegrams, from Her Majesty's Representative at Athens:—

Athens, September 8, 1892.

Board of Health have proposed five days' observation on all vessels arriving with passengers, and medical inspection of other vessels, arriving from Italian, French, English, and Austrian ports, but decree not yet signed. Eleven days proposed also on arrivals from German North Sea ports.

Athens, September 8, 1892.

Eleven days' quarantine imposed here on vessels that have left Antwerp on and after August 31.

September 9, 1892.

Sanitary Board have further proposed eleven days' quarantine on arrivals from ports between Cronstadt and Cherbourg, exclusive latter. Also eleven days' quarantine on arrivals from Glasgow, Liverpool, London, Swansea, Grimsby, and Shields. Five days' observation as mentioned yesterday on passenger ships from other British ports.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 9th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Salonica stating that vessels arriving there from Glasgow, Liverpool, Swansea, Grimsby, Shields, and London are to undergo ten days' quarantine at Klazomene or Beirut.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 6th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, transmitting the following Circular, issued by the Austro-Hungarian Maritime Board:—

In consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Antwerp, and its spreading further in Germany, the Marine Board, acting under orders received from the Minister of Commerce, orders that—

Arrivals from Belgian ports and from German ports in the North Sea shall be subjected to seven days' quarantine observations.

Wearing apparel shall be disinfected according to the regulations.

These measures will be adopted if the ship has had a healthy passage and arrives in normal sanitary conditions, in all other cases the measures to be taken shall be decided on by the Marine Board.
