THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 17th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, enclosing Circulars relating to quarantine.

The following is a translation of the material points thereof:—

The quarantine is reduced from ten to five days in the case of vessels which arrive without having, or having had during their voyage, cases of death or disease of a choleraic nature on board, and which have not on board goods, the importation of which into Denmark has been prohibited.

This reduction is not applicable to arrivals from St. Petersburg, Cronstadt, ports of the Elbe, Antwerp, and Havre.

The regulations in force prohibiting the importation of hair, horse-hair, and skins are removed, except in the case of used horse-hair.

Quarantine has been declared against vessels coming from or having communicated with Dutch ports, and the importation of wearing apparel, linen, bedding, &c. (not being part of passengers' luggage), and of rags, drills, wool-flock, used wadding, hairs, skins, fruits, vegetables, and flowers therefrom is also prohibited.

(Translation.)

Royal Decree on the Import of Railway Waggon into Sweden.

We, Oscar, &c., make known that We, after hearing Our Board of Health, are pleased to decree as follows:

The import of railway rolling-stock by sea from places declared by the Board of Health as infected with cholera, and also from Denmark, shall continue to be forbidden; but nevertheless, so long

as no other part of Denmark, except Jutland, be declared infected, empty Swedish trucks may be introduced by steam ferry from Elsinore to Helsingborg, if the following conditions and regulations be observed.

1. Neither passengers, post, or other objects may be conveyed on the steam ferry which carries the trucks to Helsingborg, and is exempted from undergoing the observation described in the Decree of August 5 last, respecting the prevention of the introduction of cholera into the Kingdom.

2. The regulations in the Decree of September 3, which allowed exceptions (from the rules issued on August 5, for preventing the introduction of cholera through Denmark) as regards the traffic from Copenhagen and Elsinore to Malmö and Helsingborg respectively, shall prevail, so far as applicable, but before the steam ferry be allowed to have free communication with Sweden, an official certificate must be delivered to the appointed medical officer, to the effect that the trucks have not been in contact with a place declared to be infected with cholera, and that the trucks have not been moved from off the steam ferry without the permission of the doctor.

3. The trucks, as soon as they run on to land, shall be taken to a special place approved by the doctor and near the harbour, and there be immediately and carefully cleansed and disinfected in accordance with the doctor's instructions and under his supervision. The doctor shall then issue his certificate that the above cleansing and disinfection has been carried out, and upon receipt of this certificate the railway authorities may take possession of the trucks.

Let all concerned obediently submit to the above.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 20th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Brussels, enclosing an extract from the "Moniteur Belge," relating to quarantine:

The following is a translation of the material points thereof:—

(1.) The importation and transit, by land or sea, of fruits and fresh vegetables, all kinds of fish, mollusks, and crustacæ, coming from countries where the existence of cholera is established or suspected, or having crossed the territory of such country, may be prohibited, or subjected to certain restrictions.

(2.) The importation and transit of the products specified in Article (1), and coming from other countries, may be subjected to "proofs of origin," to the satisfaction of the Customs Authorities.

In a decree applying the above, the Minister of Agriculture further prescribes that the importation and the transit of the same products coming from localities other than those indicated in Article 1 of the above Royal Order, and situated in Germany, Russia, France, or the Netherlands, or having traversed the territory of any one of these countries otherwise than directly by rail without discharge, shall not be authorized without production of a certificate from the local authority, certifying that the said products do not come from a place being or having been infected by cholera within the last two months from the time of despatch.

This regulation is, however, not applicable to direct transit by rail without discharge.

The certificates of origin required by Article 2 must be drawn up in such a way as to afford a complete guarantee to the Custom House Authorities, to whom they must be handed; and, in doubtful cases, the same authorities can require the production of such other justifications as they may judge necessary, and, in default of these, may require that the articles should be returned to the foreign country concerned.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 19th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Cherbourg, reporting that the Port Authorities at Granville have established medical inspection for all vessels entering. If they should come from an uninfected port and have no suspicious cases of sickness on board they will be admitted to immediate free pratique; but vessels coming from infected ports will be required to undergo 48 hours' quarantine before the medical inspection, after which they will be treated similarly to the other class of vessels.

A further Despatch, dated the 19th September, 1892, has been received from the British Consul at Dunkirk, reporting that official intimation has been received from the Sanitary Authorities to the effect that all bills of health issued by them will in future be endorsed as follows:—"On a constaté ces temps derniers à Dunkerque un petit nombre de cas de choléra" (of late a small number of cases of cholera have occurred at Dunkirk).

The Consul further reports that since the commencement of the outbreak he has endorsed on the consular bills of health the number of cases and deaths in accordance with the information supplied to him by the Municipal Authorities and the Sous-Préfecture.

of the purposes for which money may be borrowed under that sub-section.

(d.) All lands on which any buildings shall be erected or provided in pursuance of the Scheme shall, for a period of twenty-five years from the date of their erection, be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings ; and every conveyance, demise, or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this provision :

Provided that We may at any time dispense with the requirements of this paragraph, subject to such conditions (if any) as We may see fit.

(e.) Such of the lands in the area comprised in the Scheme as shall not be required for the purpose of providing accommodation for persons of the working class as aforesaid shall be dedicated as a highway or open space.

ART. II. We order that the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts shall be incorporated with this Order so as to enable the Local Authority to acquire compulsorily lands within the area comprised in the Scheme, except such of those lands, or such interests in any of those lands, as have been acquired by the Local Authority prior to the date of this Order.
