Milan, January 22.

THE Duke de Seflo is marched with a Body of our Horse towards the Frontiers of *Montferrat*, to be ready to joyn (in case there be occasion) with Prince Eugene of Savoy, who was, by our last advice, with the German Horse at *Moncalvo*, where he had received the Deputies that were sent to him by the Country, to settle the Contributions for the Subsistence of the Imperial Forces, who have their Winter Quarters assigned them there by the Emperor. Divers French Soldiers who were taken Prisoners in the late Rencounter in *Montferrat* are brought to *Asti*, who say, That the Detachment from *Casal* consisted of 500 Men, that with these were joyned 600 *Monferrins*, and that of the French very few escaped being killed or taken, which is confirmed by all the other accounts we have of this Action.

Venice, January 25. The last Letters from *Corfon* say, That the Captain General *Mocenigo* had sent 2000 Men to the *Moraz*, to reinforce the Troops appointed for the guard of the *Isthmus of Corinth*. The Chevalier *Cornaro*, Brother to the late Captain General of that Name, has taken Possession of his new Dignity of Procurator of *St. Marke*, with the accustomed Solemnity. The Standard of *St. Lorenzo Giustiniani*, lately sent hither from *Rome*, was on Sunday last in a Solemn Procession carried to the Church of *St. Mark*, after which, divers Medals with the Popes Indulgences were distributed by Order of our Patriarch.

Zolkiew, January 11. The Court will part from hence towards the end of this Month for *Warsaw*; where the Marriage of the Prince of *Poland* with the Princess *Elizabeth of Neubourg* is intended to be Celebrated on the 25th of *February*. Several new Regiments are raising for the Service of this Crown, and other Preparations are making for the next Campaign, when the King intends to take the Field at the head of a very considerable Army.

Vienna, January 28. The States of *Transilvania* have in their late Diet held at *Hermanstadt*, (at which General *Veterani*, and Count *Fulckenbam* were present on the part of the Emperor) resolved not only to provide for the Subsistence of the Imperial Forces quartered in that Country, but likewise to contri-

bute a large Sum of Money towards the carrying on of the War. The Baron *de Pace* writes from thence, that all things are quiet on those Frontiers; and that the Troops which marched lately to the Pass of *Chermetz*, were returned to their Quarters, where they are like to remain the rest of the Winter, without any disturbance from *Teckelej* or the Turks, seeing the great Snows have rendered the Mountains and Hills utterly unpassable. The Comandant of *Segnia* in *Croatia* has sent an account, That the Bassa of *Bosnia* was come with 3000 Turks to *Bagnaluca*, and that his Son was to follow with as many more to execute some design which they kept very Secret, and that the Ban of *Croatia* was thereupon drawing the Forces of that Country together to oppose them. By Letters from Count *Chizzola* Governor of *Esseck*, we have advice, That the Bassa of *Belgrade* has already sent a Bassa with a Convoy to *Illock*, to attend the coming of Sir *William Hussy*, his Majesty of Great Britain's Ambassador to the Ottoman Port. The Turkish Envoys, *Effendi* and *Mauro Cordato*, (who have been so long at *Comorra*) are now ordered to be removed to the Castle of *Poffendorf*, five Leagues from thence. The Grand Signior understanding that *Teckelej* was treating about the Ransom for General *Heuster*, dispatched a Chiaus, with orders that he should be forthwith sent to *Constantinople*, which *Teckelej* has excused, but 'tis believed he will be obliged to comply with the Grand Signiors Commands. Prince *Louis of Baden* is gone to *Bohemia* about his private Affairs, and is expected here again towards the beginning of *March*. We have an account from *Upper Hungary* of the defeat of 500 Turks near *Giula*, of whom about 150 were killed and taken Prisoners. And Prince *Eugene of Savoy* has sent hither a Relation of the late Success some of the German Troops under his Command had in an Engagement with 500 French of the Garrison of *Casal*, and 600 of the Militia of *Montferrat*, who fell upon one of their Quarters in that Country.

Bisle, January 25. On the 20th instant in the Evening, the Marquis *d'Oxelles*, who commands the French Forces in *Alsace*, came to *Hunningen* with 2000 Horse and Dragoons, who the next day passed over the Bridge there, and advanced within an hours march of *Rhinfelden*, having left 400 Men to guard the Bridge; but towards night they returned again to *Hunningen*, and on the 22d five Troops of Horse marched to *Boltheim*. What their design is we cannot yet discover, but in the mean time we are here upon our guard; our Gates towards *Alsace* and *Hunningen* are kept shut, and notice has been given by an Express to the Cantons of *Zurick* and *Berne* of this motion of the French, who give out, that more Troops are coming to join them. The German Forces quartered about *Rhinfelden* are drawing together to observe them.
