The regulations regarding the prohibition to enter, the disinfection of dangerous goods, and medical inspection of passengers, contained in the Royal Decrees of 25th and 29th August last, are applied to all arrivals from Austria-Hungary.

a normal state, otherwise the steps to be taken will be decided upon by the Authorities.

1. Travellers and goods from the Upper Danube

subjected to eleven days' quarantine.

2. Travellers and goods arriving at Tzaribrod will also be subjected to eleven days, but a deduction will be made in the number of days' quarantine undergone in Servia at the Serbo-Austrian frontier to be confirmed by a certificate granted by the Servian quarantine authorities.

3. Travellers and goods from Roumania by land or sea will be subjected to five days.

Such arrivals will be admitted to free pratique if they bring a clean bill of health vised by the Spanish Consul or by that of any other nation where there is no Spanish, are in a good state of health, and without any suspected or confirmed case of illness on board, and that they are not comprised in Rules 9, 10, or 11 of Royal Order of 31st March, 1888, 29, 31, or 32 of that of 23rd September last, nor in any other disposition which, according to the circumstances of the voyage, may render the ship liable to quarantine.

Roumania, viz.:-

The Roumanian frontier has been closed on the Austro-Hungarian and Servian side, except at Verciorova and Predeal. The frontier points at Oituz (district of Bacan), Riu Vadulin (district of Velcea), also remain open provisionally. Vessels that have left the Hungarian and Servian ports of the Danube will not be admitted in any Roumanian port.

Pending the establishment of quarantine at Verciorova and Predeal, passengers entering Roumania either by one of those frontier stations, or by one of the temporarily open points at Oituz and Rin Vadulin, will be subjected to a medical inspection, and their soiled linen will be disinfected, without prejudice to a medical observation of five days to be undergone at the place of

their destination.

Quarantine on arrivals from Black Sea coast from Trebizond to Ordou reduced to five days from the 19th September to be undergone at Sinope.

Ten full days at Zebeftche the Salonica line on

passengers arriving by railway.

Ten full days on arrivals with passengers from all the ports of the Danube, also the Roumanian and Bulgarian shores of the Black Sea, as far as Vassilico exclusive, to be undergone at Sinope in the case of departures since the 19th September. Vessels without passengers to undergo five days at Cavak.

Ten full days on arrivals with passengers from the Adriatic shore of Austro-Hungary which have sailed after 19th September to be undergone at Clazomenes or Beyrouth. Vessels without passengers to undergo five days at the same lazarettos.

Quarantine reduced to five days on arrivals Kurachee in the case of sailings after 22nd September. Ten full days at Moustapha-Pacha on passengers arriving by the railway after the 19th September.

the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vera Cruz, of which the following is an Extract:

Quarantine dues are imposed on vessels arriving at Vera Cruz in the following manner:

Steamships under contract with the Government are charged two hundred dollars (equal to £26 13s. 4d.), all other steamers and sailing vessels are charged eight cents (equal to 2½d.) a ton per day whilst in quarantine. These dues are exclusive of charges for fumigation, which amount to from fifty dollars (equal to £6 13s. 4d.) to one

hundred dollars (equal to £13 6s. 8d.). No official notice, so far as I am aware, was given before these dues were collected, and as yet I have received no written communication on the

subject from the Local Authorities.

These quarantine dues are imposed by the Federal Government in order to defray the expenses of improving, supplying, and maintaining the lazarette, and I understand are only to remain in force until quarantine is removed.

The British steamer "Roman Prince" arrived on the 19th instant from New York with a cargo of petroleum, and paid quarantine dues for one

day at the rate of eight cents a ton.
