

In the parishes of All Saints, Poplar, and Bromley Saint Leonard—
East India Dock-road, Robin Hood-lane, High-street, Poplar, and North-street.

In the parish of Saint Mary, Stratford-le-Bow—
Bow-road, Coborn-road, Tredegar-road, and Fairfield-road.

3. To empower the Board for all or any of the purposes of the intended Order to break up, stop up, or interfere with, and to cross or pass over, under, or along, as the case may require, public and private streets, roads, highways, footways, thoroughfares, railways, tramways, canals, navigations, towing paths, rivers, watercourses, bridges, and places within the area of supply, and any sewers, drains, pipes, and telegraphic, telephonic, and electric pipes, wires, and apparatus in, over, under, or along the same respectively within the area of supply, and to cross or pass over, under, or along, and break up the following railways and tramways, so far as they are situate within the area of supply, that is to say:—

The Great Eastern Railway;
The North London Railway;
The Midland Railway;
The London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway;
The London and Blackwall Railway;
The North Metropolitan Tramways;

and to lay, place, renew, alter, and maintain in, under, over, across, and along such streets, roads, highways, footways, thoroughfares, places, bridges, railways, tramways, rivers, navigations, canals, and towing paths, electric lines, wires, conductors, switches, mains, pipes, meters, and other apparatus for the supply of electricity and electric currents.

4. To authorize the Board to manufacture, hire, sell, and let dynamos, meters, burners, lamps, engines, conductors, electric lines, accumulators, machinery, and apparatus for and in relation to the production, supply, distribution, or utilization of electricity, and to make and recover rents and charges therefor.

5. To enable the Board to acquire, hold, and use patent rights or licences, and authorities under letters patent for the use of inventions, processes, and apparatus for or relative to the production, supply, or utilization and distribution of electricity.

6. To enable the Board and any local authority, company, body, or person to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements for and in relation to all or any of the purposes before-mentioned, and to enable the Board to sell, demise, or let to such local authority, company, body, or person, any lands for the time being belonging to the Board, and to enable the Board to acquire lands by agreement for all or any of the purposes of the intended Order.

7. To incorporate with and make applicable to the purposes of the intended Order with or without alteration, the provisions or some of the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847, the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871, and the Lands Clauses Acts, except the provisions of the last-mentioned Acts relating to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement.

8. On or before the 30th day of November next, a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, and a map showing the proposed area of supply, and the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down within a specified time, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of London, at his office at Clerkenwell Green, and with the Clerk of the Board, at his office at 117, High-street, Poplar,

and also at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London.

9. Printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the said office of the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next, and printed copies of the draft Provisional Order, when deposited, and of the Provisional Order when made, may be obtained at the offices of the undersigned, on payment of one shilling for each copy.

10. Any local or other public authority, company, or person, desirous of bringing before the Board of Trade any objection respecting the intended application, must do so by letter addressed to the Board of Trade (marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it, "Electric Lighting Acts"), on or before the 15th day of January, 1893, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the office of either of the undersigned.

Borough of Bideford.
(Provisional Order.)

(Power to Corporation to maintain and continue and extend Bideford Gas and Coke Company's Works; Manufacture of Gas and Residuals; Purchase, &c., of Lands; Supply of Gas and Fittings in Township, Parish, and Borough of Bideford; Rates; Provisions as to supply; and Streets; Agreements with other Sanitary Authorities, Companies, &c., as to supply; Borrowing Powers; Incorporation of Acts, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bideford, in the county of Devon (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of the said borough, intend, pursuant to the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870, to apply to the Local Government Board for a Provisional Order for the following or some of the following powers, that is to say:—

1. To authorize the Corporation to maintain and continue and from time to time to improve, enlarge, alter, renew, and repair the existing works of the Bideford Gas and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") for the manufacture, storage, and distribution of gas and the residual products arising from such manufacture, and to take over, hold, and enjoy such works and all property, rights, powers, and privileges of the Company, and to construct new or further works, and to manufacture and store gas, and to convert and manufacture and store all or any products arising in or resulting from the manufacture of gas.

2. The lands intended to be used for the manufacture and storage of gas under the said Order belong to and are in the occupation of the Company, and are situate in the township, parish, and borough of Bideford, in the county of Devon, on the east side of the river Torridge containing 2a. Or. 7p. or thereabouts, bounded on or towards the east and south by lands belonging to Sir George Stucley Stucley, Baronet, on or towards the west by the road leading to the new lime kilns of the said Sir George Stucley Stucley, Baronet, such road forming a
