PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, dated the 3rd of August, 1892, and made in the Matter of Ex parte the Lincolnshire Tramways, and in the Matter of the Tramways Act, 1870, all creditors claiming debts and liabilities affecting a sum of £2,547 15s. 5d.
