Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, November 8, 1892.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 8th November, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Lisbon, stating that Amsterdam is declared infected with cholera, and all other Dutch ports suspected, from the 1st instant.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 5th November, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following Translation of a Decree issued on the 28th ultimo: - The Sanitary Ordinances of the 27th August and 14th October, 1892, are hereby extended, and the introduction into the Kingdom, by land or sea, from France and Austro-Hungary, of bedding in use is prohibited, even though it be not destined for commerce.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegrams from Her Majesty's Representatives at Constantinople, Athens, and Madrid :-

" Constantinople, November 9, 1892. "Quarantine on arrivals from Italy, Egypt, and Montenegro, with passengers on board, reduced to three days; without passengers on board, medical visit only required.

"Quarantine on arrivals from New York suppressed, and medical visit substituted.

Quarantine on arrivals from every part of the North of Europe and South of France reduced to five days."

"Athens, November 9, 1892. "Medical inspection substituted for quarantine on arrivals from London, Liverpool, Swansra, Grimsby, and Shields, sailing on or after the 22nd ultimo."

"Madrid, November 9, 1892. " Free pratique allowed to arrivals from Rotterdam, which sailed after the 7th instant."

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, November 10, 1892.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 3rd November, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, stating that ships in ballast arriving at Varna or Bourgas, as well as at ports on the Danube, will have to undergo quarantine, if they have touched at any port of an infected country.

The port of Sistov has now been opened to

both travellers and goods.

The entrance of macaroni and other farinaceous products into Bulgaria is prohibited.

The following is an extract therefrom :-

November 5, 1892. No case of cholera having occurred at Stettin since the 16th October, 1892, and therefore as I conclude that the cholera has terminated, I abolish herewith all my notices and probibitions, &c. In respect to the combatting and prevention of the spread of cholera, only those prohibitions remain that give effect to the hindrance of importing cholera from infected places and countries.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :-

1. This Warrant may be cited as the Inland Post Further Amendment Warrant, 1892.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1892 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Warrant"), and the Inland Post Amendment Warrant, 1892.

3. Clause 80 of the Principal Warrant shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be and the same is hereby substituted in lieu thereof, namely :-

Compensation for Loss and Damage of Articles in Registered Packets.

"80.—(1.) Subject to the provisions of this Warrant if any article of pecuniary value enclosed in, or forming part of, a Registered Postal Packet, be lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the Postmaster-General, the Postmaster-General may pay to any person or persons who may, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, establish a reasonable claim to compensation (having regard to the nature of the article, the care with which it was packed, and other circumstances) such sum as he may think just: Provided that-

(a.) If only the postage and registration fee payable in respect of the said Postal Packet have been paid by the sender, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £5.

(b.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid, the sum of one penny has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £10.

(c.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of two pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £15.

(d.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of three pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £20.

(c.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of four pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £25.

(f.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of five pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £30.

(g.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of sixpence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £35.

(h.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of seven pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £40.

(i.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of eight pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £45.

(j.) If in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid the sum of nine pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £50.

(2.) The compensation payable in respect of a registered Parcel shall be in substitution for, and not in addition to, any compensation which would have been payable under this Warrant in case the Parcel had not been registered."

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language while in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or engine, or wilfully interfere with the

comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage or engine, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage or engine. person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, at the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the

journey

11. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to th. ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics,

or daily labourers.

13. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front platform, and not in the interior, or on the roof of any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon any carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

14. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to ride on any engine, or travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

15. No person except a passenger or intending passenger, or a servant of the Company, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or engine; nor shall any passenger travel in or upon any carriage otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

16. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the
