PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the eighteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three the salaries of the Assistant Masters in the Nautical School of the Royal Hospital School at Greenwich are fixed at seventy pounds rising to one hundred and twenty pounds by annual increments of ten pounds.

“And whereas we are of opinion that the remuneration of certain of these Assistant Masters should be increased, we beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the following scale of salaries, dating from the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to be substituted for that established by Your Majesty's Order in Council aforesaid, viz. :—

“Two Assistant Masters seventy pounds rising to one hundred and forty pounds

“Six Assistant Masters seventy pounds rising to one hundred and thirty pounds

“As may be requisite:—Assistant Masters seventy pounds rising to one hundred and twenty pounds

By annual increments of ten pounds.

“We also beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to authorize an allowance of twenty-five pounds a year, dating from the twenty-fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to a Master acting for the Head Master during his occasional absence.

“And whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-nine, entitled ‘The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,’ it is amongst other things enacted that the Admiralty may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of officers appointed for the service of Greenwich Hospital.

“And whereas by the eighth section of an Act

passed in the thirty-sixth year of Your Majesty's reign entitled ‘The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872,’ it is enacted that ‘the provisions of the twentieth section of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, as far as the same relate to salaries shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind.’

“And whereas the Storekeeper and Cashier at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, who was formerly employed in the service of Greenwich Hospital, has retired from Your Majesty's Service on account of age, his retirement taking effect from the fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two,

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the grant to such officer of a pension at the rate of two hundred and four pounds five shillings and four pence a year from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to take effect from the date of retirement.”

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled “An Act to amend the Law respecting the office of County Coroner” it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alterations should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it shall be lawful for the said justices, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition shall be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such county as in that

Act thereafter provided, and that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such county, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said justices into consideration, and the justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the justices for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act, and that such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when such petition shall be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such county shall forthwith give or send a proper copy of such petition, certified under his hand, to every Coroner for such county, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if She shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which may be presented to Her by any Coroner of the same county, concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ de Coronatore Eligendo for the purposes of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of that Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and that every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas by "The Local Government Act 1888" the powers and business of the said justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each county have been transferred to the Council of such county.

And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-second day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three under the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act the county of Essex was divided into two districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said recited Act, which said districts were named respectively "The Eastern Division" and "The Western Division" of the said county of Essex and respectively comprised the several parishes named and set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council made the ninth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act for facilitating the union of liberties with the counties in which they are situate," the liberty of Havering-atte-Bower in the said county of Essex became from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two united with the said county of Essex.

And whereas a petition was on the fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two presented to Her Majesty by the County Council of Essex praying that the said county of Essex might be divided into three districts for Coroners' purposes under the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act, which said petition with a description of the said proposed districts

and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded was duly certified to Her Majesty.

And whereas all the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act in that behalf have been complied with in relation to the said petition.

And whereas the Coroners for the said county have not presented any petition to Her Majesty.

And whereas Her Majesty has with the advice of Her Privy Council taken into consideration the said petition, and is minded to make such alteration and division as aforesaid.

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, direct, and declare, and it is hereby ordered, directed, and declared, that from the date hereof,

1. The county of Essex shall be divided into three districts for Coroners' purposes, and for the purposes of the said first recited Act.

2. The said three districts shall be named respectively "The Eastern Coroner's District," "The Western Coroner's District," and "The Romford Coroner's District," and the said districts shall respectively comprise the parishes and places set forth in that behalf in the schedule hereto.

3. This Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the third day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn of the new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn and of the new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green, all in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-first day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-third day of the same month a part of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Kilburn in the said county and diocese was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate within the limits of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Kilburn and was called ‘The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn.’

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twelfth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month certain contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint John Kensal Green in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Kilburn, were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke the Evangelist situate at Kilburn within the limits of the said new parish of Saint John Kensal Green and the same consolidated chapelry was called ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn.’

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of May in the year one

thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-third day of the same month a part of the said new parish of Saint John, Kensal Green was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Jude Kensal Green, situate within the limits of the last-named new parish, and the same district chapelry was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Jude Kensal Green.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn and the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn, and the said district chapelry of Saint Jude Kensal Green, have each of them under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Kilburn of the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn, and of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn of the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn and of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn which is described in the first Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn, and so that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green, which are described in the second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended as aforesaid and are thereon coloured pink shall be respectively dissevered from the last-named new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London and to be annexed to the new parish of

Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn in the same county and diocese being:—

"All that part of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn which is bounded upon the south-west by that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Jude Kensal Green in the county and diocese aforesaid which is described in the first part of the Second Schedule hereto upon the west and upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid at the point where Canterbury-road joins Granville-road and extending southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Peel-road and continuing thence still southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seven and a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Malvern-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the house and premises called or known as No. 123 Malvern-road and the house and premises called or known as Gothic Villa and numbered 121 Malvern-road and extending thence south-westward and in a direct line to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of one hundred and ten feet or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn from that portion of the new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green aforesaid which is described in the first part of the second Schedule hereto as aforesaid.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid being:—

"I. All that part of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green which is bounded upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid (including the portion thereof described in the first Schedule hereto) upon the north and upon the north-west by the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-west and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn from the new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green aforesaid where such boundary diverges in a north-easterly direction from the middle of Marban-road at which point the western boundary of the civil parish of Paddington crosses the middle of the same road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of ten and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Fernhead-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Denholme-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine chains and thirty-eight links or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Saltram-crescent and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of thirteen yards or there-

abuts to the point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence which forms the north-western boundary of the house and premises called or known as Bramley situate upon the north-eastern side of the said last-mentioned road and extending thence that is to say from the said point in the middle of the said last-mentioned road north-eastward and in a direct line to and along the same wall or fences for a distance of ninety-five feet or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid which boundary coincides at this point with the eastern boundary of the civil parish of Paddington aforesaid.

"II. And also all that part of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green which is situate on the northern side of Kilburn-lane and is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn from the new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green aforesaid at the junction of Lancefield-street with Kilburn-lane aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the same lane for a distance of twenty feet to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall which divides the houses known as Hope-terrace from the building and premises called or known as the London and Provincial Laundry, and extending thence that is to say from the said point in the middle of the said lane northward for a distance of twenty-three yards or thereabouts to and along such wall to its northern extremity and continuing thence along a wall which belongs to the said Laundry and which extends in the same straight line for a further distance of twenty-five yards or thereabouts to the southern side of the main line of the London and North-Western Railway and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of twenty yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said main line of railway due south of the mile post situate on the northern side of the same main line of railway indicating a distance of one hundred and eight and a half miles from Birmingham at which point the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Jude Kensal Green of the new parish of Saint John Kensal Green, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and of the new parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist Kilburn aforesaid all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 171 of the 12th of November, 1892, is to be modified, and that the following regulations are to be observed, viz:—

1. Exclusion from the Harbour (Sfratto) with provision for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the Harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs, and shall in all cases be ordered, after coaling, to quit with all despatch—

(a.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.

(b.) Vessels having cases of cholera on board.

(c.) Vessels which have had on board a case of diarrhoea, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(d.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage.

(e.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea, which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Quarantine for ten days to be reckoned from arrival at Malta with provision for handling cargo in quarantine.

(a.) The following shall be subject to a period of ten days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling

cargo local labourers under ten days' quarantine, viz:—Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.

3. Medical Inspection.

(a.) All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine are required to undergo the same restrictions as the vessel on which they arrive.

(b.) Passengers arriving direct from England on vessels having a duly qualified medical officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, provided that the medical officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of dysentery, diarrhoea, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(c.) The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the Master of the vessel.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 21st November, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, giving information as to quarantine measures adopted by the Bulgarian Government.

The following are the measures:

1. Travellers coming from Servia by the Danube or by Tsaribrod are subjected to eleven days' quarantine.

The same measure is applied to those travellers who cross Servia.

2. Travellers arriving from Russian ports of the Danube and of the Black Sea, as well as from the Asiatic shore of the Black Sea, up to and including Ordou, are subjected to a quarantine of eleven days.

3. The quarantine of eleven days for travellers coming from Austria-Hungary by the Danube is reduced to eight days.

4. The quarantine of five days imposed on travellers coming from Roumania is reduced to three days.

5. Travellers and goods may only enter Bulgaria by Tsaribrod, Lom, Srisktof, Roustchouk, Varna, and Bourgas. Goods may also be imported at the ports of the Danube of Widdin, Rahoos, Nicopol, and Silistria. For the present the frontier of European Turkey remains open.

6. The baggage and clothes of travellers who are subjected to quarantine will be disinfected.

7. Goods coming from contaminated towns are delivered after having undergone a quarantine of eleven days and a disinfection piece by piece.

8. Goods arriving from towns free from infection situated in contaminated countries, and those which come from countries free from infection but which pass through infected countries, as well as goods sent in transit, are delivered after a quarantine of five days.

9. Goods arriving directly from countries free from infection without touching at contaminated places are delivered without undergoing quarantine or disinfection.

10. Goods must be accompanied by a certificate stating the sanitary condition of the place from which they came. In default of such a certificate goods will be considered and treated as if they came from a contaminated country.

11. All goods, with the exception of those in transit, will be opened and examined in order to establish the fact that there does not exist amongst them some article the importation of which into Bulgaria is forbidden.

12. Parcels arriving by post are allowed to enter Bulgaria after the articles which they contain have undergone the quarantine imposed upon goods and after they have been opened and disinfected. If they should contain prohibited articles, their admission will be forbidden.

13. The importation of the following articles is forbidden if they come directly or in transit from Russia, Belgium, France, Austria - Hungary, Servia, and the Ottoman Empire:—

- a. Underlinen and bed linen, if for sale.
- b. Used clothes, rags, and all remains of pieces of woven stuffs, patterns of old cloth, used sacks, cords, and old pieces of paper.
- c. Raw skins, furs, articles made up with fur, used or not used, such as those worn by travellers, bladders, guts, fresh or dry, unwashed wool, and cotton wool.
- d. Milk foods, such as milk, butter, cheese, fat, and cream, such as Kaimak.
- e. All sorts of fresh fruits, such as lemons, oranges, cedras, and pomegranates.
- f. Fish, fresh, salted, or smoked, sardines, preserved meats, and caviare.
- g. Meats, fresh, salted, or smoked, sausage, hams, and Bologna sausages.
- h. Oil in leather bottles.
- i. Hair of cattle and horses (with the exception of articles made of dyed horsehair for sieves and other purposes), the hair of pigs and of camels, and all sorts of feathers (with the exception of dyed feathers).
- j. Mineral waters.

The present prohibition does not apply to the luggage of travellers or to the effects of persons

moving house, saving always the sanitary regulations applying to such goods.

The present Order comes into force on the day of publication.
