Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, and Caledonian Railway (Rates and Charges) Order Confirmation Act, 1892.

NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to "The Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888," and the Order of the Board of Trade thereunder, dated the 6th day of December, 1892, that :—

1. Altered rates and charges will come into effect on the 1st day of January, 1893, for the conveyance of merchandise traffic from stations on the Caledonian Railway, and on railways leased or worked or jointly owned by them, and to which the said Act is applicable.

2. A book or books will, on and after the 16th day of December, 1892, be ready and kept, as required by Section 14 of the Regulation of Railways Act, 1873, at the office for the conduct of merchandise traffic at each of the Company's stations and wharves, and also at their receiving offices, showing the new rates which will, on and after the 1st day of January, 1893 (but subject to alteration from time to time), be charged for the carriage of traffic from such station, wharf, or receiving office, to any place to which merchandise is booked therefrom.

3. Every such book is from the date of this notice bona fide accessible and open to the inspection of any person during all reasonable hours without the payment of any fee.

4. If the Board of Trade intimate to the Caledonian Railway Company that they are satisfied that for public convenience it is necessary for more than one copy of such book or books, or of any part thereof respectively, to be accessible at any station, a duplicate, or, as the case may be, an extract of so much thereof as the Board of Trade shall prescribe, will be at once supplied accordingly.

5. No previous publication shall be required in respect of any additional or amended entries in such book or books which may be made during the months of January and February, 1893.
