In the County Court of Warwickshire, holden at Birmingham.

In Bankruptcy, No. 50 of 1888.

Re Job Hartley.

UPON the application of Job Hartley, the abovenamed bankrupt, for a review of the conditional Order of Discharge, granted to him on the 16th day of May, 1889, which conditional Order of Discharge was in the terms following, namely:—That the said bankrupt be discharged subject to the following condition, that he shall consent to judgment being entered against him in the County Court of Warwickshire, holden at Birmingham, by the Official Receiver, as Trustee, in the sum of £1 500; and it is further ordered that the said judgment shall not be enforced without leave of the Court; and the said bankrupt having consented to the said judgment, and upon taking into consideration the affidavit of the said bankrupt, filed on the 21st day of November, 1892, the reports of the Official Receiver as to the bankrupt's conduct and affairs, and upon hearing the Official Receiver and Mr. Vachel, Counsel for the said bankrupt, and upon a review of the said conditional Order of Discharge, it is ordered that the said conditional Order of Discharge be varied and altered as follows:—That the discharge of the said bankrupt be suspended until the 16th day of May, 1893, and that the said bankrupt be discharged as from the 16th day of May, 1893. And that the said judgment of £1,600 now entered against the said bankrupt in the County Court of Warwickshire, holden at Birmingham, be annulled and set aside.—Dated this 15th day of December, 1892.
