NFORMATION has been received by Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador in Paris, that the blockade established on the 15th June last by the Government of the Republic, on the portion of the Slave Coast comprised between the limits of the French and German Possessions of the Popos and the eastern limits of the French Possessions of Porto Novo, of which notice was given in the Loudon Gazette of the 17th June, was raised on the 19th instant.
