Rome, January 27. The Pope was taken very ill the last week, his Indisposition beginning with a great Cold, and the breaking out of St. Anthony's Fire in one of his Legs, which put him into a Fever; But since Tuesday last, when his Leg was opened, he has been much easier, and his Fever is abated, but he continues very weak. On the 19th Instant was published here a Prohibition of all Commerce with the Kingdom of Naples, and strict Guards are kept at the Gates of this City to examine all Persons and Goods that come in, though our last advices say, that the City of Naples not only continues free from all Infection, but that at *Conversano*, where it first appeared, the Sickness is much decreased. The Prince de *Lichtenstein*, the Emperor's Minister at this Court, has received Orders to return to *Vienna*, and is accordingly preparing for his departure. We hear from *Florence*, that a Marriage is concluded between the Elector *Palatin* and the Princess of *Tuscany*.

Geneva, February 2. We have advice, that about 8 or 10 days ago 14 or 1500 Men, most Irish, marched from *Chambery*, and having joined with 1500 French drawn from other Garisons, they posted themselves before *Montmelian*, with a design, as 'tis believed, to bombard it, the French having lately sent divers Boats up the River *Jure* laden with Bombes and Carcasses: This place is very strong, and in a condition to make a long Resistance, having in it a good Governor, and a Garison of 1200 Men. About 50 Dutch Soldiers who were taken Prisoners at the Battle of *Fleury*, and were afterwards forced by the French to serve among their Troops in *Savoy*, having found an opportunity to escape from the place where they were quartered, passed lately through this City in their return towards *Germany*.

Venice, February 3. The Senate have received Letters from the Captain-General *Mocenigo*, wherein he gives them an account, that he found both their Land and Sea Forces in a very good condition, and that he hoped to be very suddenly in a posture to undertake some considerable Enterprize. The next week are expected here 800 Italians, and 600 Germans, newly raised for the Service of this State, and besides these other Levies are making to reinforce our Army in the *Levant*.

Vienna, February 4. The last advices from *Constantinople*, (whereof we made mention in our last) say likewise, that the French, according to their usual way of telling News, had confidently published there the entire defeat of the English and Dutch both by Sea and Land by their Kings Forces, and had demanded permission to make publick Rejoycings; but that two days after Letters arrived from my Lord *Pager*, (Envoy Extraordinary from Their Majesties of Great-Britain at this Court) with a faithful Relation of the Transactions of the last Campagne, which were communicated to the Grand Visier and the *Caimacan*, who thereupon presently ordered a stop to be put to the Illuminations, and other Marks of Joy prepared by the French Ambassador, to his great Mortification. From *Croatia* we hear, that on the 17th of the last Month a Party of Turkish Horse appeared before *Jessenowich* and Summoned the Place, but were quickly dispersed by the Cannon from the Town. That about the same time another Party of Turks fell upon the Out-guards of *Dubizza* and killed 2 of them, but were soon driven back by the Garison; And that all the Confines from *Jessenowich* along the River *Umma* are well provided with Soldiers, and vigilantly guarded. The Emperor has sent Count *Harrach* to *Jasprucke* to present the Order of the *Golden Fleace* to the Young Duke of *Lorraine*. *Tscheley* demands 25000 Ducats for General *Hoffler's* Ransom.

Paris.

Paris, February 13. Our Differences with the Court of Rome are growing to a great height. The Pope has condemned as Heretical, Schismatical, and scandalous the Propositions, 'That the Pope is not Infallible; and, 'That he is subject to a General Council; And has Excommunicated all those that maintain them, and consequently the Clergy and Parliaments of this Kingdom. At the same time he continues to refuse his Bulls to above 50 Bishops, that have been nominated by the French King to several Bishops since the beginning of these Disputes. On the other side the King seems resolved, if they be not granted very speedily, to call a General Assembly of the Clergy in order to Consider what Resolutions to take for the supporting the Rights and Privileges of the Gallican Church. Things standing thus, it cannot be thought that the News of the Popes Illness has been received with any great trouble at this Court, where they are expecting with much impatience the arrival of another Courier from Rome, and in the mean time all the French Cardinals have had notice given them to be in a readiness to repair thither. This Court continues very jealous of the new Converts, and has sent Orders to the Intendants of the several Provinces to cause strict Search to be made in their Houses, to see they have no Arms, but what are allowed to Gentlemen only by the Kings late Declaration. 'Tis said, that Orders are given to Assemble the Arrierman for the Guard of our Sea Coasts, and that all the Governors of the Maritime Places are commanded forthwith to repair to their respective Commands. Several Troops are marching towards Dauphine, from whence they are to pass into Savoy.

Yarmouth in the Isle of Wight, February 11. This morning came in at the Needles a small Buss belonging to Denmark, which was taken yesterday by a Dutch Capten of 18 Guns. The Master of the Buss says, that they took her out of a Fleet of about 20 French Merchant Men bound from Havre de Grace to several Ports about Ushan. That yesterday morning off of Alderney he saw two of their Majesties Ships sail in with the said Fleet, that one of our Men of War fought their Convoy, being a Ship of 28 Guns, and after about an hours Dispute took her; That the other English Man of War at the same time fell upon the Merchant Men, and took most of them. That their Majesties Ships stood to near to Cherbourg, that they fired several Guns into the Town, and that they are gone with their Prizes to Plymouth.

That the said Principal Officers and Commissioners will be ready at the said times to receive any Proposals that shall be offered them of any such Goods and Materials, and to agree for, and buy the same
