And for the better effecting the purpose of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission, and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do further by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our

United Kingdom as you may deem expedient.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said

Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the questions herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Edward Austin Browne, Esquire, Master of Arts, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the fifty-sixth year of Our Reign.
