No. 23.—CHANNEL AND WESTERN STATION.

FRANCE—WEST COAST.—ILE DE GROIX.

Port Tudy—Harbour Lights.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 365 of 1891:—

The French Government has given notice, that on 8th January, 1893, two lights will be exhibited from the pier heads at Port Tudy, northern side of Ile de Groix:—

Fort Tudy East Pier Light will be a fixed red light, visible through an arc of about 140°, or between the bearings of S. 51° E., through south, and S. 89° W., and elevated 36 feet above high water.

Port Tudy West Pier Light will be a fixed green light, elevated 36 feet above high water.

Approximate position, lat. 47° 38' 40" N., long. 3° 26' 45" W.
