Geneva, February 13. Onlieur Catinat is now with a finall Body of French Troops before Montmelian, into which they have fired a get many Bombs and Carcasses, but hitherto with fuleefect. The Governor and Garilon, which confifts of 1400 men, have quitted the Suburbs or Lower Town, and are retired into the Upper, fituated upma Rock, which they are refolved to defend to the left extremity. 'Tis said, that they have made a filly, in which they cut off 2 or 300 of the

Turin, February 2. Since the defeat of part of the Garison of Casal by the Germans quartered in Uniferrat, the French have received another Repole at Veillane, which they thought to have furpited; To this purpose, the Sieur de Catinas and the Marquis de Feuquieres marched thither the 26th pit in the night, the first with about 1400 Feet, Soo Horle, and one Piece of Cannon of to Pound Bill from Sufa, and the other with a like Detachement of Foot and Horse, and 3 small Pieces of Can-m, from Pignerol. There were quartered in the Town (which is not at all fortified) about 7 or 800 Foot, detached out of the Regiments of Schaufenhary, Lorraine, and the White-Crofs, and 400 Dragons of Piedmont, under the command of the Count de Massell, who having timely notice of the Esemies design, had put his Men into a posture to recive them; The Marquis de Fenquieres came first before the place, and 200 of his Granadiers advaned to the Barriers of the Suburbs, and forced the Guid that was there, confifting of 10 Men, but they were quickly beaten back again by a Detachement of the Garison, as were likewise the Troops appointed to fecond them; whereupon their whole by, although reinforced by Monsieur Catinat, retied to a greater distance from the Town, having altwo Captains of G. anadiers, with a great many Man, belides divers that were taken Prisoners. Howentitley continued the rest of the day to Cannonade the Suburbs, which are unprovided of all manner of drace, and commanded by feveral Hills which the Esemy had possessed themselves of, but towards Etming the Marquis de Pianezza appearing with 120 Imperial Horse within fight of Veillane, after haring forced the Guard of Horte which the French hid placed at St. Anchorine, they abandoned their Enterprize, and retired towards Sufa, (not thinking has for the Troops of the Garifon of Pignerol to itten thither by the way they came) leaving behind them 4 Ammunition Wagons, and 4 Artillery Horfer. On our fiele were killed in this occasion a Lieutenant, a Quarter-master, and some private Soldiers. Viena, February 15. We have yet received no inher particulars of Colonel Polland's late Victory

above 800 of them were killed, and 300 taken Priioners. The Turks have abandoned the Fort of Tirul near the Theysse, which Colonel Polland has Garisoned, and he and the Rascian Captain Antonio have fince made Excursions within 2 Leagues of Belgrade. But from Croatia we hear, that the Turks under the command of the Baffa of Bosnia have taken the Palanque and Castle of Novi upon the River Unna, the Garison surrendring upon Articles; and that the late Bassa of Canasa heads another Party, who ravage and do great michief in that Country. The advices from Transit vania say, that the States of that Province were affembled at Togaras, to confider of what had been proposed to them by Count Falckenbam in the Emperor's name. That the Imperial Troops, which lately marched towards the Confines of Valachia, were returned to their Quarters; and that Teckeley, according to the laft news they had of him, was encamped at Bucarest in Valachia, defigning to march towards Orfowa, but that he had not with him above 2000 Men, many of his Followers having deferted him, and being gone home to their Houses. There have been lately sent to Translivania 200000 Floring to buy up Forage and Provisions (that abound there) against the approaching Campague, which is a fign that our Troops will be betimes in the Field. We are affured, that the Emperor's Forces, together with the Auxiliary Troops defigned against the Turks this next Summer, will confift of above 80000 Men, besides 6000 Imperialists in the Service of the Duke of Savor, and 20000 that are to act on the Rkine. Cardinal Collonitz began his Journey this day towards Rome.

Ritibonne, February 19.
