NORTH ATLANTIC OCEAN.

*English Channel Approach—Floating Wreck.*

INFORMATION has been received through  
the Board of Trade, that the Master of the British  
steamship "Medway" reports having passed on  
7th February, when in approximately lat. 48° 46'  
N., long. 8° 35' W., a vessel floating bottom up,  
about 10 feet above water.

This wreck presents a danger to shipping.

In this locality the current usually sets in a  
north-westerly direction about ten miles a day.

*Hope Island Light Re-exhibited.*

porary discontinuance of Hope Island Light, south  
shore of Coringa (or Cocanada) Bay:—

Information has been received, through the  
India Office, that on 1st January, 1893, Hope  
Island Light, fixed white, was re-exhibited; but  
that, in consequence of damage to the coloured  
glasses, the sector of red light intended to be  
shown in the direction of Sacramento Shoal was  
not exhibited.

Approximate position, lat. 16° 49' N., long.  
82° 19' E.

SOUTH-WEST PACIFIC OCEAN.

*Breakers Reported Southward of Ball's Pyramid.*

INFORMATION has been received from  
Lieutenant and Commander H. E. Purey-Cust,  
Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Dart," that  
Mr. Nicolls, a resident on Lord Howe Island,  
states that, during south-westerly gales, breakers  
have been seen five miles southward of Ball's  
Pyramid. Vessels therefore should not approach  
that side of the island within the distance of  
seven miles.
