And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas Mr. S. D. Chopping, as lord or owner of the said Fair and the tolls thereof, has consented, in writing, that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held in a certain public street or highway in the village and parish of Stebbing, within the Petty Sessional Division of Dunmow, on the 10th and 11th daysof July, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.
