The present Notice is dated 27th March, 1893 (No. 60).

1. Exclusion from the harbour (Sfratto) with provision for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs; and, shall in all cases be ordered, after coaling, to quit with all despatch.

(b.) Vessels having cases of cholera on board.

(c.) Vessels which have had on board a case of diarrhoea, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(d.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage.

(e.) Vessels arriving from Arabian Ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

(f.) Vessels arriving from any port of the Vilayet of Tripoli.

2. Quarantine for ten days with provision for handling cargo in quarantine.

(a.) The following shall be subject to a period of ten days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessels crew on lighters or to employ for handling cargo local labourers under ten days' quarantine, viz., Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.
