ORDER of the Local Government Board.

Alteration of General Order. Election of Guardians, 1893:—

Bedminster Union.
To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bedminster Union, in the County Borough of Bristol, and the County of Somerset;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Bedminster Union, amongst others, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed the manner of conducting the Election of Guardians of the Poor for the several Parishes comprised in the Union;

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said General Order as hereinafter-mentioned:

... Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—For the purposes of the Election of Guardians of the Poor of the said Bedminster Union for the year ending the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the Returning Officer may alter the place specified in the Notice published by him in accordance with Article 9 of the above-cited General Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one

thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, as the place for obtaining or handing in voting papers when they have not been delivered or collected as the case may be:

ARTICLE II.—Notice of any alteration made under Article I of this Order shall be affixed to the principal external gate or door of the Workhouse of the Union, and on such places in every Parish in the Union as are ordinarily made use of for affixing thereon notices of parochial business

THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1893.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Animals from Countries in First Schedule Prohibited.

- 1.—(1.) Unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, animals brought from any of the countries named in the First Schedule to this Order shall not be landed in England or Wales or Scotland.
- (2.) The Animals Order of 1886 shall be read and have effect as if the countries named in the First Schedule to this Order were included in the List of Prohibited Countries named in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to that Order.
