The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are the present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered

to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, April 26, 1893.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 20th April, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, enclosing translation of a Royal Decree relating to quarantine. The following is an extract therefrom:—

ROYAL PROCLAMATION concerning the Importation of Rags from certain Countries being permitted until further notice. Given at the Castle, Stockholm, April 14, 1893.

WE, Oscar, etc., etc., after obtaining the opinion of the Board of Trade and of the Medical Department, hereby give notice that, until there be due cause to rescind this decision, rags may be imported from Norway, Denmark, Great Britain, and Germany (with the exception of Hamburg), without let or hindrance from the Proclamation of November 18, 1892, anent the importation of goods which might be deemed likely to introduce cholera. The following rules, however, must be observed:—

1. The rags are only to be imported in compressed bales.
2. The importation shall take place by sea to a town, or else by rail to Mon, Charlottenberg, or Storlien.
3. When the goods are imported a declaration shall be forthcoming emanating from the Swedish and Norwegian Legation, Consul or Vice-Consul, or if there be none at the place whence goods are despatched, signed by the proper civil authorities, that the bales are from no other place than such from which the importation of rags is permitted, as above stated.

A similar declaration may be made out by any person for whose statement any of the above-mentioned authorities will hold himself responsible.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:—
Borough of Haverfordwest.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Haverfordwest, in the County of Pembroke, acting by the Council, being the Urban Sanitary Authority of that Borough;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the powers and provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for paving, lighting, and otherwise improving the Town of Haverfordwest, and the adjoining Townships of Prendergast and Carlett, in the Parishes of Prendergast and Uzmaston, in the County of Pembroke," certain Commissioners were appointed to execute such

Local Act, and by a Provisional Order issued by Us, the Local Government Board, on the 28th day of May, 1877, all the jurisdiction and powers of such Commissioners remaining vested in them at the time of the passing of The Public Health Act, 1875, were transferred to the Council of the Borough of Haverfordwest, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid;

And whereas the said Provisional Order was confirmed on the 23rd day of July, 1877, by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Belper Union, &c.) Act, 1877 (hereinafter termed "the Confirmation Act"), and by Section 2 of that Act it is enacted that the said Urban Sanitary Authority shall repay out of the rates authorized by the said Local Act, and in the manner provided by Section 234 of The Public Health Act, 1875, the sum of £10,000, borrowed by the said Commissioners under the powers of the said Local Act, within the period of sixty years commencing from the date of the said Confirmation Act;

And whereas by Section 3 of the said Confirmation Act provision is made for the transmission to Us of an annual return showing, amongst other things, the amounts which have been invested or applied for the purpose of any sinking fund for the discharge of moneys borrowed on mortgage under the said Local Act, and it is further provided that "If it appears to the Local Government Board, by that return, or otherwise, that the said Urban Sanitary Authority have failed to pay any instalment, or to set apart the sum required for the sinking fund, or have applied any portion of the money set apart for the sinking fund, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, to any purposes other than those authorized, they may, after hearing the said Urban Sanitary Authority, if desirous of being heard, by Order, to be issued and published, and to have the same effect as an Order issued by them under the Public Health Act, 1875, direct that a sum not exceeding double the amount in respect of which default has been made shall be paid, set apart, and invested, or applied as part of the sinking fund, and any such Order, shall be enforceable by writ of Mandamus, to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice";

And whereas it appears to Us that of the sums required to be set apart in respect of the sinking fund for the discharge of the aforesaid sum of £10,000 up to the 23rd day of July, 1892, the said Sanitary Authority have failed to set apart sums amounting to £314 10s. 8d.;

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that the said Sanitary Authority should be required to make provision as hereinafter mentioned with regard to the sinking fund in respect of which default has been made as aforesaid, and We have informed the said Sanitary Authority accordingly, and that We were ready to hear them on the subject if they were desirous of being heard, and the said Sanitary Authority have not shown any reason why such an Order as is herein-after expressed should not be made:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order and Direct the said Urban Sanitary Authority of the Borough of Haverfordwest, within two months from the date of this Order, to set apart and invest or apply, as part of the sinking fund for the discharge of the said sum of ten thousand pounds, a sum of six hundred and twenty-nine pounds one shilling and fourpence, being double

the amount in respect of which default has been made by such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid.
