Falmouth, May 25. 🐴 He 18th instant put in here several Merchant ships from London outwards bound; who came out in company with about 50 fail more, bound for the fourthwards; but were forced back from their course by contrary winds; and part of them sup-posed to be put in about Pigmouth. This day the Merchant ships set sail again with a fair wind, onely the ship called Three Friends of Love, laden with wheat for the Barbado's, continues yet in Port, to repair some desects in her

Milse, May 2. About two dayes fince were mustered all the Forces both of the Old and New Levies, which were drawn from several places to their Rendezvous near this City, where the Governour took a view of them, and afterwards disposed of them to their respective Quarters. Legorn, May 15. The 8th inflant attived here a ship of this Town, commanded by Captain Bracelli from Sciots, having aboard 212 Slaves taken by a Cortaire of this place from a French ship bound from Constantinople for Canea with 500 Turks, between whom passed a sharp dispute, in which most of the rest of the Tu ks were killed. The toth inffant came in the Bonadventure in it days from Algier, where the less the Fame and the Phenix both of them bound for this place, and three Fregats belonging to His Majesty of Great Britain; by this vessel we are advised that all or the most part of the Algerine ships are feturned into Port without any other purchase then two light ships tar ken from the Genouele. A Bark arriving from Tunis, cells up that several of those Corsaits which have been employed towards Candia are lately returned, and their Gal-

ploy'd towards Candia, are lately returned, and their Gal-lies preparing to put to lea upon the fame fervice.
On Saturday last, the young Prince of Tuscan returned from his travels to Florence, at whole Entry the Great Guns were discharged from all the Forts.

The French Fleet of 16 men of War's besides their Gal-liess are gone out to sea, but as you their design not known.
